On January 23, 2022, at approximately 1924 hours, Ofc. A. Litton, Ofc. C. Bozetti and I (Ofc. S. Ham) were dispatched to 517 Olivia St., reference burglary of structure.

Upon arrival, I met with the witness (Jerry Jackson). Jerry stated a dark complexion male, approximately 6`00" tall, wearing a gray hoodie sweatshirt, dark pants and a blue in color face mask entered the residence at 517 Olivia St. Jerry stated he saw the suspect inside the house searching through drawers and left on the Center St. side of the property. Jerry stated he believed the suspect traveled north on Center St. Jerry stated he did not see him carrying anything big out of the property. Jerry stated if he had something it was small enough to fit inside of his pockets. I asked Jerry where the suspect entered the property at, and he stated he first attempted the side unit on the Olivia St. side and pointed to the door. The door was located behind a fence and the entrance to that side of the property was on the Center St side. Jerry stated that door must've been locked because Christopher was unable to get in there and walked around to the unit at the rear. Jerry stated the suspect entered the rear unit through the door on the backside of the property.

Sgt. D. Kouri and Ofc. T. Anglin arrived on scene. Sgt. Kouri advised Ofc. Bozzetti and I to canvass the area in search of the suspect.

I began to canvass the area, traveling north on Duval St. when Ofc. Bozzetti advised over the radio that he was in pursuit of the suspect. Sgt. Kouri advised they had one male in custody at the corner of Olivia St. and Center St.

Ofc. Bozzetti stated to me he located the suspect, later identified as Christopher Valdez in front of 531 Olivia St. Ofc. Bozzetti stated he asked Christopher to have a seat on the curb and Christopher would not. Ofc. Bozzetti stated he went to reach for Christopher to sit him down and Christopher took off running west on Olivia St. Ofc. Bozzetti stated he caught up to Christopher at the corner of Olivia St. and Center St. Ofc. Bozzetti stated Christopher was taken to the ground and Ofc. Litton assisted in handcuffing him. See Ofc. Bozzetti's supplemental for further information.

I arrived back at 517 Olivia St. and spoke with Sgt. Kouri. Sgt. Kouri stated Jerry positively identified Christopher as the suspect. Sgt. Kouri asked me to retrieve a sworn witness statement from Jerry. Christopher was escorted to the backseat of my patrol car, along with the property he had on his person.

Jerry agreed to fill out a KWPD sworn witness statement, and it stated "I saw a man in a hoodie/mask/dark pants break into 517 Olivia St., rummage through the back unit and leave via Center St. He tried to enter the front unit but could not open the door. He then entered the back unit and went through drawers/objects before leaving." I spoke to Jerry and asked him if he was able to identify the suspect and he stated, "yes, I saw his face in the light." Jerry stated "he turned towards me and his mask was flipped down" that's how he could see his whole face. Jerry signed the sworn witness statement and I collected it to submit it into KWPD records department.

I spoke to a second witness from 513 Olivia St, later identified Darryl Wallace. Darryl stated he stepped outside to throw away garbage when he heard a weird sound coming from the property. Darryl stated he believed the people renting had left the property because their car was gone. Darryl stated the noises caught his attention and he looked through the fence. Darryl stated he saw someone attempting to look through the blinds at the front unit. He stated again he watched the suspect go up to the windows and attempt to look through the blinds to see if anyone was there. Darryl stated the suspect then went to the back unit, which he believes was left unlocked. Darryl stated Jerry contacted someone on the phone to advise they believed someone was breaking into to the property. Darryl stated he

kept an eye on the opened back door and that the suspect was inside for what he perceived is a long time. I asked Darryl how long he believed the suspect was inside of the rear unit and he stated 2-3 minutes. Darryl stated the suspect was inside of the bedroom and then he came out as if he was about to leave. Darryl stated the suspect started "messing with the door." Darryl stated it is a double door and he believed the suspect was trying to get it to close, but then the suspect re-entered the unit and began going through the refrigerator. Darryl stated the suspect then exited the rear unit, shut the doors, and tried to go back into the front unit again. Darryl stated the suspect was unable to go inside the front unit and then the suspect left. I reiterated to Darryl that the suspect attempted the front door after going into the back and he said yes at least three more times. I asked Darryl which front door he is speaking about and he stated the one beside the light. The front door Darryl was speaking about was located behind the fence on the Olivia St. side. The same door that Jerry had mentioned in my first encounter with him.

I returned to my patrol car and Sgt. Kouri advised Christopher of his Miranda Warnings and he stated he understood but did not wish to speak to him.

I placed the property and evidence inside of evidence bags and set them inside the back of my patrol vehicle. While inside the trunk of my vehicle Christopher uttered that he did not believe that it was a crime to sleep at somebody's property if nobody was there.

Ofc. Litton stayed on scene to process further evidence. See Ofc. Litton's supplemental for further information.

A victim who was renting the rear unit later identified as Carroll Robertson, arrived on scene. I retrieved the property from the back of my patrol vehicle and set them on the hood of my car. Carroll identified a silver sterling beaded necklace that belonged to her. Carroll stated the silver sterling beaded necklace was located on the nightstand to the right side of her bed. Ofc. Litton stated to me that the necklace was in Christopher's front right pocket. I provided the property to Ofc. Bozzetti to submit into property and evidence. I provided Carroll with a property receipt for her necklace.

I transported Christopher to Monroe County Detention Center without incident.

Christopher Valdez entered a dwelling with the intent to commit an offense of theft therein. Christopher is in violation of F.S.S 810.02-3-b Burglary of an unoccupied dwelling. Christopher attempted to enter a second dwelling and in doing so was in violation of F.S.S. 810.02-3-b defined under F.S.S. 810.07 Prima facie evidence of intent. Christopher attempted to enter the second unit at the same address by stealthily and without consent of the occupant but was unable to gain access.

Christopher Valdez was in violation of F.S.S. 812.014 Theft. While Christopher was inside the rear unit, he knowingly obtained a silver sterling beaded necklace valued at approximately \$200.00, with the intent to permanently deprive the owner of their property.

Christopher was in violation of F.S.S. 843.02 Resist officer without violence. Christopher disobeyed the verbal commands of Ofc. Bozzetti to have a seat and decided to run west on Olivia St to escape capture.

My Axon BWC was activated.

On 23JAN22 at 1925, I (Ofc. T. ANGLIN) responded to 517 Olivia Street regarding a report of multiple rental property burglaries that just occurred. KWPD Dispatch advised via two-way radio that a suspect wearing a grey hooded sweatshirt and a blue face covering was observed on the property and was now walking north on Center Street. Upon my arrival to the area, I met with Officers on scene as well as a witness, JERRY JACKSON and the caller, RICK HASKINS.

After speaking with witnesses and Officers on scene, Sgt. D. KOURI and I elected to clear 517 Olivia Street, by way of accessing the 832 Center Street side of the property, which the suspect was seen on the grounds by witnesses. Ofc. A. BOZZETTI proceeded to move east on Olivia Street from Center Street and canvass the area for the suspect.

I affixed a six-foot nylon lead to one-inch nylon collar K-9 JIGSAW was wearing and retrieved him from the rear of my patrol vehicle. As I began to approach the property, (832 Center Street), Ofc. A. BOZZETTI advised via two-way radio that he had a suspect actively fleeing on foot, heading west on Olivia Street.

I proceeded to the intersection of Center Street and Olivia Street as I observed both the suspect, later identified as CHRISTOPHER EUGENE VALDEZ and Ofc. A. BOZZETTI fall to the ground on the north side of the intersection, (Approximately ten (10) feet from my position). I moved in closer with K-9 JIGSAW and began giving K-9 commands/announcement as both Sgt. D. KOURI and Ofc. A. LITTON assisted Ofc. A. BOZZETTI, (See supplemental reports for details). After some time, VALDEZ complied with commands and directions given and was handcuffed without further incident, (See supplemental reports). I maintained my overwatch position as Officers stood VALDEZ up and escorted him to Ofc. S. HAM'S patrol vehicle.

I proceeded to Ofc. S. HAM'S patrol vehicle and maintained an overwatch position with K-9 JIGSAW as Officers unlocked one of VALDEZ' handcuffs and removed a small dark colored backpack from his person, (See supplemental reports for details). Once VALDEZ was placed back in handcuffs and secured in Ofc. S. HAM'S patrol vehicle, I secured K-9 JIGSAW in the rear of my patrol vehicle. I later gathered information for my report and departed the scene.

At no time did I interview VALDEZ. My Axon body worn camera was active during this incident and uploaded into the server.

On 01/23/2022, around 19:23 hours, I (Ofc. Bozzetti) was dispatched to 517 Olivia St, reference a burglary. Just prior to my arrival, Sgt. Kouri provided an updated description of the suspect and last known direction of travel, over the radio. He stated the suspect, was wearing a grey, hooded sweatshirt, and a blue mask. He was last seen traveling north on Center St. On arrival, I positioned my marked KWPD patrol vehicle on Center St., just north of the intersection with Truman Ave.

I exited my vehicle and approached 517 Olivia St on foot. Sgt. Kouri, K-9 Ofc. Anglin, Ofc. Litton and Ofc. Ham were also on scene. We spoke with Dr. Jerry Jackson, the initial witness to the burglary, and obtained a further updated description of the suspect. Jackson described the suspect as a tall male with dark skin and an average build. He stated the suspect was my height (6'3") and slightly heavier than me (175 lbs). He stated the suspect was wearing a grey, hooded sweatshirt, dark pants, and blue mask. Jackson stated the subject had his hood pulled over the top of his head and the blue mask was concealing most of his face. Jackson said he did see the suspect's face at one point.

After speaking with Jackson, I returned to my patrol vehicle and began canvassing the area for the suspect. I drove north on Center St. and then took a right on Olivia St. I traveled a short distance east on Olivia St. before noticing a tall male, later identified as Christopher Valdez, matching Jackson's description. Valdez was on the sidewalk, in front of 531 Olivia St. and appeared to have possibly just walked out from the driveway, which leads to the rear of the property. I stopped my vehicle and instructed Valdez to have a seat on the curb. He did not comply, therefore, I instructed him a second time to have a seat on the curb. Instead of sitting on the curb, Valdez attempted to flee from me. He began sprinting west on Olivia St. toward the intersection with Center St. I quickly closed the gap between us and grabbed Valdez's sweatshirt, once he was within reach. I guided him to the ground at the intersection of Olivia St. and Center St. As soon as Valdez was taken to the ground, he began physically resisting my attempts to place him in handcuffs. Sgt. Kouri immediately assisted me with gaining control of Valdez. Sgt. Kouri secured his right arm behind his back and I secured his left arm behind his back. After gaining control of Valdez, Ofc. Litton placed him in handcuffs.

Valdez complained that he was unable to breathe and was subsequently placed in an upright, seated position. Ofc. Litton saw a bulge in his front left pocket and began searching Valdez incident to arrest. Ofc. Litton pulled a beige colored pouch out of Valdez's front left pants pocket and placed it on the ground next to Valdez. Inside the pouch were 6, gold in color, bracelets. Ofc. Litton escorted Valdez to Ofc. Ham's patrol vehicle and finished the search of him and his property. K-9 Ofc. Anglin found a silver ring with 5 clear, rectangular stones, on the ground in the area Valdez was taken to the ground. All evidence was collected and placed into evidence bags. A short time later, the current occupants of the rear unit at 517 Olivia St., later identified as Carroll Robertson and Raymond Robertson, arrived on scene. Carroll stated a silver beaded necklace which was found by Ofc. Litton in Valdez's front right pants pocket was hers. She stated the approximate value of the necklace was \$200. I transported the evidence to the KWPD

On 01/23/2022 at approximately 1930 hours, I (Ofc. A. Litton) was dispatched to 517 Olivia Street in reference to a burglary with the suspect still in the area.

I arrived at the intersection of Petronia Street and Center Street and canvassed Center Street on foot. The suspect was described as a black male wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt and approximately six feet tall, possibly heading North on Center Street. I walked toward Olivia Street until I arrived at 517 Olivia Street. As I stood outside 517 Olivia Street, I heard Officer C. Bozzetti on Key West radio channel 1 was in a foot pursuit with a suspect matching the description. Officer C. Bozzetti and the suspect ran West on Olivia Street, toward K-9 Officer T. Anglin, K-9 Jigsaw and Sergeant D. Kouri, where he stumbled and fell as he arrived at their location. I ran to their location and placed the suspect, later identified as Christopher Valdez, in handcuffs.

To assure he had no weapons concealed in his clothing, I began to search Valdez in the street. I removed a small, tan bag and a pile of napkins from his front left pocket and continued to pat him down for weapons. Sergeant D. Kouri and I stood Valdez up and walked him to Officer S. Ham's patrol vehicle where I removed the contents of his pockets and placed him in the back of the vehicle.

Along with the small tan bag and napkins in Valdez's front, left pocket, there was also a small white bike light. From Valdez's front, right pocket, I removed a set of keys and a silver beaded necklace. Valdez's back right pocket contained a single \$50 bill. I also searched Valdez's backpack, which was taken off him just before placing him in the back of the patrol vehicle, The backpack contained a bottle of women's perfume, a white baseball cap, a pair of women's sunglasses, various coins, and a bag of airline pretzels.

I was then tasked with processing the scene at 517 Olivia Street. No fingerprints could be found on the door reportedly used by Valdez to enter the residence. Being a career burglar, this would explain the napkins in his pockets. However, the reporting party stated he witnessed Valdez opening drawers in the residence. The small, round drawer pulls would've proved difficult to obtain fingerprints. However, touch DNA may be found from the suspect on the knobs used to open the drawers. The residents stated all drawers were closed when they left the residence and some were later found to be opened. With permission from the residence and the company that manages the rental unit, I removed nine knobs from all drawers in the bedroom and three from the kitchen. I placed the knobs in Key West Police property to be processed for touch DNA later. I also photographed the residence, and the drawer knobs taken, and later uploaded the photos to Evidence.com through the Axon Capture app.

Axon BWC was activated during this investigation and later uploaded to Evidence.com.

On January 23, 2022 at around 1720 hours, KWPD Communications received a call from Rick Haskins in regard to a burglary of a structure that was occurring. Haskins was informed by Jerry Jackson that he had observed a subject, later identified as Chris Valdes, breaking into the rental property located at 517 Olivia Street. Haskins is responsible for this rental property, as well as all other Key West Vacation Company Properties.

While en-route to the location, I contacted Haskins and obtained an updated description of Valdes, as well as a potential direction of travel. I aired this information over KWPD Com1 communications. Multiple Officers responded to the scene and began to search for Valdes. I met with Jackson and confirmed the suspect information that had been aired over KWPD Com1. It was undetermined if Valdes was still on the rental property, attempting to conceal himself from the uniformed Police Officers now on scene. Due to this information, K9 Ofc. Anglin retrieved K9 Jigsaw from his marked KWPD Patrol SUV. K9 Ofc. Anglin and I were about to begin clearing the rear of the burglarized property, when Ofc. Bozzetti aired over KWPD Com1 that he was in a foot pursuit was Valdes.

Ofc. Bozzetti was chasing Valdes west on Olivia Street, approaching our location. As Ofc. Bozzetti reached the intersection of Center Street, he was able to close the gap between himself and Valdes and direct him to the ground. Once on the ground, Ofc. Bozzetti started to attempt to gain physical control of Valdes. Valdes was immediately resistive and would not place his hands behind his back. I placed my right knee across, Valdes' shoulder blades, to ensure he was unable to regain footing and continue to flee. Valdes was given several verbal commands to stop resisting and place his hands behind his back. Valdes continued to struggle; however we were able to eventually place handcuffs on Valdes, which were applied by Ofc. Litton. After this struggle, Valdes stated the phrase "I cant breathe", which is now commonly used by arrested subjects after a foot pursuit, or fighting against Uniformed Police Officers. There were no airway obstructions to Valdes' or any valid reason he was making these comments. Valdes was placed in a seated position to further ensure there were no issues or visible injuries.

Once Valdes was in custody and no longer resisting, Jackson, who witnessed the foot pursuit and apprehension, walked over to us. Jackson positively identified Valdes and the suspect who had committed the burglary, as well as attempted burglary to the front of the KWVCP rental property. Jackson also completed a sworn written statement attesting to what he saw take place during the entirety of this incident.

Ofc. Litton walked Valdes over to a marked KWPD Police SUV and performed a search of his person. Valdes had in his actual physical possession many items of jewelry, perfume, currency, keys, a cell phone and he was wearing a black and multi-colored back-pack. All of these items were later taken back to KWPD for further processing. One of the items, a silver beaded necklace, was later positively identified as being stolen from one of the victim (see original report). While in the rear of Ofc. Hams marked Police SUV, I read Valdes his Miranda Warnings. Valdes said he did

not wish to speak with me. Valdes did make several spontaneous utterances inquiring if it was illegal to look for somewhere to sleep in people's backyards.

Ofc. Litton remained on scene to process the scene. Ofc. Ham transported Valdes to MCDC. Ofc. Bozzetti, Ofc. Anglin and I responded back to KWPD to begin evidence processing and administrative paperwork.

It should be noted that Valdes is a potential suspect in an additional attempted burglary case 22-0464, which occurred approximately fifteen (15) minutes prior to this incident. Valdes has an extensive felony laden criminal history and is a known burglar.

I attempted several times to activate my BWC during the initial apprehension, however later realized it was not activated until after he was placed into custody. My BWC was activated for other parts of this investigation and later downloaded at KWPD.
