

- WHEREAS; the City of Key West is proud to posthumously honor its native son Theodore "Fats" Navarro, who was born in Key West, and after spending his childhood and adolescent years in the Bahama Village neighborhood of Key West, went on to a meteoric career as a jazz trumpeter and was one of the seminal figures of the bebop style of jazz improvisation, and as such made an indelible mark on American culture; and the style of jazz that ultimately became synonymous with modern jazz; and
- WHEREAS; Fats Navarro is remembered as a musical pioneer who revolutionized jazz music and who was often referred to as a musical genius by his peers and is credited by some as being the harmonic link between Louis Armstrong and the beboppers in the 1940's; and
- WHEREAS; Fats Navarro, who in 1949 won Metronome Magazine's award for best trumpet, and who, in 1982 was elected by a panel of international jazz critics into the Down Beat Hall of Fame; and
- WHEREAS; Fats Navarro's discography in bebop lists in the hundreds, including recordings with groups led by Bud Powell, Charlie Parker, Tadd Dameron, Kenny Clarke, Coleman Hawkins and Dextor Gordon, among others, with many of these recordings being compositions by Navarro himself; and
- WHEREAS; Fats Navarro's musical legacy is now documented and intertwined with the Bahama Village Music Program and, as well, is one of our island city's great historic legacies, and forever woven into the cultural fabric of Key West, America and the world; and
- WHEREAS; Fats Navarro, whose unparalleled musical creativity and exceptional talent have continued to delight jazz fans and inspire jazz musicians for decades and as one of the fathers of bebop, Fats' music will continue to remain vital to the artistic imagination of generations of music lovers everywhere; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Teri Johnston, Mayor of Key West along with District VI Commissioner Clayton Lopez, do hereby proclaim April 5th, 2022 as
