


City of Key West



Bicycle Racks



- Installed over 54 bike parking spaces
- Key West has nearly three thousand bike parking spaces
- Map is on our website where residents can submit requests



Bike Lights

- 100s of bike lights given out by staff and our Police Department
- Those in need can stop by the police station to pick up free lights to stay visible and safe

Micromobility Ordinance

- Went into effect July 21, 2021
- Restricted ebikes and scooters from narrow sidewalks
- Set a 15mph limit for ebikes on multi-use trails such as North and South Roosevelt promenades







Bicycle and Pedestrian Counts

- Collaborated with FDOT to collect non-motorized counts along North and South Roosevelt and Staples Bridge
- FDOT can make counting devices available for local projects
- Counted 19k bike trips/week across all sites in 2021 compared with
 14k in 2020

Crosstown Greenway Improvements

- Partnering to increase street trees

Public Transportation Advancements

- Most bus drivers received a pay increase

- Key West Intermodal Center (KWIC)



Final Mile Mode Shift Project

- Cycling amenities near 80+ bus stop across the lower Keys
- Includes bike lockers, repair stands, transit lights
- Project expected to go to bid this Summer








Keys COAST
