On 06/28/2022 at approximately 1345 hours, Officer D. Wallis, Officer K. Hansell, Officer V. Arguelllo and I (Officer T. Getchel) responded to 721 South Street unit 1 in reference to a domestic battery.

While several Officers and I were enroute to 721 South Street the KWPD Dispatch was still on the phone with the reporting party. The reporting party (later identified as Marie Kravitz) told KWPD Dispatch that she has locked herself and her 11 year of age son in a bedroom. Marie locked herself in the bedroom due to her older son (Arnold Kravitz) who broke glass, and she got a cut on her face from the impact of the glass.

Upon arrival, Officer K. Hansell and I were walking up to the residence when I heard a loud sound of glass shattering. Both Officer K. Hansell and I approached the front door and saw Arnold standing in the front room. Arnold was wearing a white tank top and gray shorts. Arnold's tank top had blood smeared across the front of it. The front room had glass from the door and books from a nearby book shelve all over the floor. Directly behind Arnold was a glass door that leads into the residence. The glass door had several broken panes of glass. Officer K. Hansell and I asked Arnold to step outside multiple times. Arnold refused and started to bend forward to pick something up off the ground. Officer K. Hansell and I walked into the residence and Arnold crossed both his arms behind his back. Arnold began to yell at us saying we are trespassing. I grabbed Arnolds left arm and Officer K. Hansell grabbed Arnold's right arm. Arnold immediately pulled his arms away and brought them to the front of his waist and crossed them. Arnold would not bring his arms behind his back. Officer K. Hansell and I made multiple commands to stop resisting and to put his hands behind his back. Office D. Wallis arrived on scene and was giving Arnold verbal commands as well. Arnold still refused to listen to our commands. Officer D. Wallis, Officer K. Hansell and I forced Arnold onto the couch where I was able to place his left hand into handcuffs. We continued to struggle with Arnold until Officer K. Hansell was able to place his right hand into the other handcuff.

Once Arnold was handcuffed both Officer K. Hansell and I escorted Arnold to my patrol car. When we were on the sidewalk Arnold began to widen his stance and push his back into us. With Arnold doing so he cause Officer K. Hansell to fall over onto the cement sidewalk. I then pulled Arnold to my patrol car and Officer K. Hansell helped me place Arnold in the back seat of my patrol car.

Officer V. Arguello arrived on scene, and I asked him to remain with Arnold at my patrol car so I could speak to Marie.

I then went back inside the residence to talk to Marie. Marie told me that she was trying to get Arnold to take his medication. Arnold was refusing to take it and pushed her. Marie then went inside the house and closed the glass door separating her and her younger son from Arnold. Arnold was very upset at this incident and then he punched the glass door. The glass from the door hit Marie in the chin causing her to bleed. Marie then grabbed her younger son and ran to the bedroom and locked the door. Marie remained in the bedroom until we arrived on scene.

Arnold did sustain several lacerations to his right hand. Officer V. Arguello and I transported Arnold to the Lower Keys Medical Center so that he could get medical attention for his wounds. The nursing staffs cleaned Arnolds wounds and had to give Arnold six stiches in his right hand. Arnold had two small lacerations that were approximately 1-inch each on the bottom of his right palm.

After Arnold was medically cleared from Lower Keys Medical Center, I transported him to the Monroe County Detention Center.

On Tuesday, June 28, 2022, at about 1347 hours, I (Officer Wallis) responded to 721 South St to assist officers in reference to a physical disturbance. While enroute, dispatch advised the caller was struck by her eldest son and was now locked inside her bedroom with her youngest son. Upon arrival, I observed Officers Tyler Getchel and Katie Hansell attempting to detain a subject, later identified as Arnold Kravitz. I observed Kravitz was clenching both arms in front of his body as the Officers were attempting to place his hands behind his body. I displayed by TASER and began giving verbal commands for Kravitz to stop resisting. Kravitz did not comply and continued to actively avoid the officers attempts to place his hands behind his back. Due to the confined location, broken glass on the ground and the officers hands on with Kravitz I chose to assist with hands on in order to gain control of Kravitz. I observed Officer Getchel had Kravitz's left hand secured in restraints and assisted Officer Hansell in securing Kravitz's right hand.

Officers Getchel and Hansell escorted Kravitz to a patrol vehicle as I attempted to contact the caller and young child in the residence. I announced my presence through a shattered front door window. Both the caller, Marie Kravitz, and her 11 year old son emerged from a locked side bedroom in the residence as I entered. I observed a cut on Marie Kravitz's chin, which she advised happened when Arnold Kravitz punched and shattered the glass of the front door. I noticed blood on myself, Officer Getchel and Officer Hansell that we determined came from Kravitz. Sgt Duponty arrived on scene and was briefed on the incident. I provided Marie Kravitz with the case number assigned to Officer Getchel and a victims right brochure. My BWC was activated during this incident and uploaded in to Evidence.

On 6/28/2022 at approximately 1330 hours, I, Officer K. Hansell responded to 721 South St., Apt 1 after dispatch requested an additional unit for the call. The caller, Marie Kravitz, stated that her adult son, Arnold Kravitz, had refused to take his medicine upon her request and had punched the square glass portion of a door inside the aparment. Marie had also told dispatch that she had locked herself and her juvenile son in the bedroom out of fear of Arnold.

As I approached on foot I heard someone yelling and what sounded like glass breaking coming from the apartment Marie had called from. I got to the door of the apartment and could see a lighter skinned male, wearing a grey tank top, which matched the description given by Marie, standing in a small front room. Arnold responded to his name by saying we could not enter and we (police officers) were trespassing. As I stepped inside I saw broken glass all over the tile floor and other miscelleanous items thrown about the room. It should be noted that Arnold had blood all over both of his hands and arms that I could see in plain view.

I approached Arnold and attempted multiple times to have him step outside so we could speak to him and his mother. I saw a black female and a younger male standing in the small kitchen/living room area on the other side of the broken glass doors. The female had what appeared to be blood on her face. I asked Arnold if that was his mother and he stated no. I again tried to get Arnold to come outside and at this point I put my hand on his right arm to escort him out. Arnold intentionally pulled away from me and tried to step back from me. I again took hold of Arnold's right arm at the elbow area and attempted to place his hand behind his back, as Officer Getchel came into the room and took a hold of Arnold's left arm. Arnold immediately intentionally pulled his arms away from both of us and forcefully held them down in front of his stomach area. Officer Wallace arrived and started giving Arnold's commands to stop resisting and displayed his Taser. Officer Wallace's Taser malfunctioned. At this point we were able to rotate Arnold face down onto a small couch that was up against the wall on the south side of the small room we were in. Officer Getchel had gotten Arnold's left wrist in a handcuff and as we layed Arnold on the couch, I was able to grab the right handcuff and place it on Arnold's right wrist.

Officer Getchel and I escorted Arnold outside to Officer Getchel's marked patrol vehicle. As we walked toward the vehicle on the sidewalk Arnnold pushed off of me with his body and my feet got caught up in either his feet or Officer Getchel's feet and I fell to the ground. I immediately got up and assisted with placing Arnold into Officer Getchel's vehicle. Officer V. Arguello arrived on scene and stood by with Arnold. I went back into the residence to check on Marie's condition and to retrieve my BWC that had fallen off during Arnold's resistance. I found my BWC on the ground mixed in with the glass from the doors on the floor.

I located Marie and her juvenile son inside the residence. Marie stated that Arnold had refused to take his medicine and when she stated she was calling the police, Arnold punched the glass in the door, breaking it and cutting her in the process. Marie also stated that Arnold has mental health issues (schizophrenia) and had just been released from jail for another incident. I collected her full information along with both sons information for Officer Getchel's report.
