On 06/28/2022, at 2059 hours, I (Ofc. R. Perez) was dispatched to 1105 Duval St. in reference to a medical assist.

Upon arrival I see a male later identified through F/NCIC as Yvens Lazarre on his knees. He then collapses and I try to roll him over to the recovery position. Rescue 2 arrives on scene and began to treat Lazarre. Lazarre had agonal breathing and was shaking uncontrollably. The gave him sternum rubs and he did not react to them. Lazarre began a cycle of regaining and losing consciousness. When Lazarre would regain consciousness, he would begin to pull away and tense up. Lazarre began to resist so the paramedics and I held him down so they could treat him. One of the paramedics administered Narcan and a few moments later Lazarre sprung up to his feet. I gave Lazarre several loud verbal commands to get on the ground. Lazarre was trying to pull away and flee. I was in fear for Lazarre's safety, so I used a modified straight arm take down technique to gain control of Lazarre. Several firefighters assisted me with placing Lazarre on the ground and gaining control of him. Lazarre began to yell to let go of him and we explained that we were here to help. Lazarre calmed down and we were able to sit him up.

Lazarre was placed on the stretcher and was going to be transported to Lower Keys Medical Center. Ofc. Agleev arrived on scene and was asked by the paramedics to ride in the ambulance with them for their safety. I contacted Sgt. A. Rodriguez and advised him that I used a straight arm takedown on the patient that was taken down. I then drove to Lower Keys Medical Center.

Upon arrival I entered the room Lazarre was placed in. Lazarre began to make outlandish statements. He stated that a male abused his wife named Mercy. When asked about his wife's last name he stated he did not know his wife of 4 months last name because she was a Navy Seal. He stated that when he finds the man that harmed his wife, he would kill him. He stated he was having hallucinations of vengeance. We asked if he was on any illicit substances, he stated he smoked crack earlier, he smoked marijuana in the morning and he had between 2 to 5 shots of an alcoholic beverage. We asked Lazarre when was the last time he slept and he stated he does not remember. We asked if he is supposed to be on medication and he stated he was given medication for mood swing and a bipolar disorder. We asked if he had been taking his medications, he stated he hasn't taken them in years.

All of the substances Lazarre claimed to have consumed do not have hallucinogenic side effects.

Based on Lazarre's statements and the mental state he was in, he is unable to determine if he was in need of a psychological evaluation. I believe that without care or treatment, Lazarre could cause serious bodily harm to himself or others. Lazarre was Baker Acted and left in the care of the hospital staff.

My AXON BWC was activated during this incident.

On June 28, 2022, at approximately 2100 hours I, Officer D. Agleev, responded to the intersection of Duval and Virginia Streets, reference an intoxicated subject.

Upon arrival I observed Officer R. Perez and several KWFD guys holding down on the ground a black male, later identified as Yvens Lazarre (DOB 01/13/1996). After Lazarre stopped resisting, he was placed into sitting position. I stayed with Lazarre, while medical personnel were evaluating his condition. Lazarre told Rescue personnel, he took crack cocaine that day in addition to marijuana and alcohol. Lazarre was transported to the Lower Keys Medical Center (LKMC). Due to Lazarre being unruly and combative, I rode with Rescue to the ER.

Lazarre was subsequently Baker Acted, following Officer Perez' investigation (see KWPD case 22-3662).

Sergeant A. Rodriguez responded to the LKMC and gave me a ride back to my vehicle.

My BWC was activated and uploaded to Axon Evidence.
