A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, SPONSORING A MARTIN LUTHER KING BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION AND MARCH ON MONDAY, JANUARY 16, 2023, BETWEEN THE HOURS OF NOON AND 4:00 P.M AT NELSON ENGLISH PARK. AUTHORIZING THE CLOSURE OF CERTAIN STREETS FOR THE MARCH; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS the City Commission desires to provide a Martin Luther King March on the date and times herein described.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Commission of the City of Key West, Florida, as follows:

SECTION 1. That in Resolution 19-174, the City Commission directed the City Manager to "develop language that restricts the use of polystyrene by individuals on public property, temporary vendors on public property, or entities engaged in a contractual relationship with the local government for the provision of good or services, unless such use is otherwise preempted by law"

SECTION 2. "That the vendor/lessee/licensee acknowledges the City's concern about the negative environmental impact of using disposable polystyrene products, which are neither readily recyclable nor biodegradable. Vendor/Lessee/licensee/contractor therefore commits to refrain from the use or distribution of single-use polystyrene/plastic items, including but not limited to single use polystyrene/plastic straws, bags, plastic utensils and "to go" packages for food or products sold on any property leased from the City"

SECTION 3. That the City of Key West hereby sponsors a Martin Luther King Birthday Celebration and march on Monday, January 16, 2023, between 12:00 to 4:00 p.m.

SECTION 4. That all provisions of the Code of Ordinances with respect to a march on the City right-of-way shall be observed.

SECTION 5. That the celebration will begin at the Nelson English Park (Martin Luther King Community Center) Thomas and Catherine Streets followed by the march.

SECTION 6. That the applicant acknowledges this authorization may be revoked by the Commission or the City Manager, due to exigent circumstances such as the resurgence of COVID-19 in the community.

SECTION 7. That this Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the signature of the presiding officer and the Clerk of the Commission.
