RE: City of Key West Cruise Ship Future Fee Adjustments

Dear :

In July 2018, the City adjusted cruise ship fees, including passenger disembarkation and docking, to adequately cover the direct and indirect cost of providing security, safety, and transportation for cruise passengers and for maintaining the City of Key West cruise ship facilities and infrastructure. The previous increase had occurred in 2004.

In order to continue covering those cost, the City will implement a regular yearly increase beginning November 1, 2022. The increases will be based on the average change in the U.S. Department of Commerce Consumer Price Index (CPI) for U.S. City Average, all Urban Consumers as reported by the Bureau of Labor Statistics for the 12 months prior to August 1 of each year.

## November 1, 2022, CPI of 1.7% (FY19/20) estimated rates based on actual CPI of 1.3% (FY20/21), actual CPI @ 5.3% (FY21/22) and 8.3% for (FY22/23):

• Passenger Disembarkation: \$12.34 per passenger

Dockage: Tonnage: 0-30,000 \$3.5246 per linear ft
30-40,000 \$0.0558 per ton
40-50,000 \$0.0499 per ton
50-60,000 \$0.0441 per ton
60-70,000 \$0.0382 per ton
>70,000 \$0.0352 per ton

- Security Surcharge: \$0.74 per passenger
- For ships docking at the Outer Mole, \$2.21 per passenger/crew transportation surcharge. The charge is based on the manifest and apply to 80% of the passengers and 50% of the crew regardless if they disembark or not.
