WHEREAS, the William Weech American Legion Post 168 broke ground for its home at 803 Emma Street on August 25, 1951, during the era of segregation, and in partnership with the VFW Walter R. Mickens Post 6021, served as host to more than ten thousand black military personnel deployed in the Florida Keys; and

WHEREAS, black service members hold an essential role in the success of the United State military, shaping the successful outcome of individual missions, and paving the way for progress towards achieving equality in the armed forces and American society; and

WHEREAS, on October 16, 2022, the William Weech American Legion Post 168 hosted a Historic Marker Unveiling Ceremony and celebration of the post, and its facilities for the public; and
