



Proposed Budget (2023)



# Notice of Funding Opportunity

- Outline funding source requirements
- Define stakeholder interests
- Establish funding request parameters (what project, what amount)



#### Draft Content

- Define themes
- Draft exhibits and other visuals
- Conduct benefit cost analysis (BCA)
- Gather letters of support



## Review and Quality Control

- Revise according to the City's input
- Grammar and spelling review
- Check for visual consistency and a clear story from start to finish
- BackcheckBCA calculations



#### Final Submission

- Check for compliance with submission requirements
- Compile final document
- Submit according to funding source guidelines


