-- John Paul Greeson Arrest Narrative:

On Sunday, September 4, 2022, at approximately 2225 hours, I (Ofc Andrade) was on the corner of Caroline Street and Telegraph Lane, where I had just completed a call, when I was approached by a male employee of General Hosreplay, 423 Caroline Street.

The employee told me that they required police assistance, saying there was a male in the establishment that was bothering females, acting belligerent, and refusing to leave. The employee identified himself only as Chris.

I immediately began to make my way to General Horseplay. As I was doing so, I witnessed a male (later identified as John Paul Greeson) actively engaged with a General Horseplay employee. The employee pushed Greeson away and Greeson began to advance back towards the employee. I shouted "Stop," and Greeson turned to look at me. I secured Greeson by his arms placing them behind his back and attempted to escort him away so I could interview him. Greeson immediately began to pull away from. I ordered Greeson to stop, several times, but Greeson continued to attempt to break his arms free of my hold by tensing his arms and body and actively pulling away. I then pushed Greeson of balance, let go of his right arm, and immediately took hold of his left arm with both hands while simultaneously performing a hip toss over my right hip. Greeson went to the ground landing on the front of his torso. Greeson almost immediately rolled onto his right side attempting to get up and still trying to pull away from my grasp. I ordered Greeson to lay on his belly, but he refused. I then manipulated Greeson's left arm forcing Greeson to his belly. Greeson continued to resist me efforts by tensing his whole body and attempting to pull away.

A General Horseplay employee (later identified as Jeffrey Allen Lehman), in an effort to assist me, held Greeson's right arm. I then placed handcuffs on Greeson and placed him in the recovery position, on his right side. I then offered Greeson the opportunity to stand and he accepted. An unidentified male passerby assisted me in helping Greeson to his feet.

Ofc Gruba arrived on scene. I obtained Greeson's identification card, which he told me was in his back right pocket. Ofc Malak then arrived on scene, and I quickly briefed him on the situation.

Ofc Malak later informed me that he spoke with Lehman who told him that Greeson was causing a major disturbance in the licensed establishment of General Horseplay, by harassing female patrons, and being loud and aggressive, while refusing to leave, towards staff who were asking him to leave. Lehman added that Greeson had to be physically escorted off the premises and in doing so Greeson resisted his efforts and pushed against Lehman, causing Lehman to push Greeson away from his person. (This is the event I witnessed as I arrived on scene). Lehman stated he did not wish to pursue any charges personally against Greeson.

Sgt Rodriguez then arrived on scene an interviewed Greeson regarding the hip toss I had performed on him earlier. Greeson suffered minor abrasions below his left eye, the right side of his face, his upper lip, and his right knee.

Ofc Gruba and I then walked Greeson across the street to my patrol vehicle where I performed a search of his person subsequent to arrest. While searching Greeson, who was wearing swim trunks with pockets, I pulled the right front pocket inside out. In doing so two small plastic baggies containing a white powdery substance fell out onto the ground. I informed Sgt Rodriguez who collected the baggies from me. Sgt Rodriguez asked Greeson if he had any other illegal substances on his person, warning him that if he introduced contraband into the detention center, he would receive an additional charge. Greeson replied that he did not have anything.

I finished the search of Greeson's person and placed him in the backseat of my patrol car and transported him to the Monroe County Detention Center for processing. After arriving at the facility and assisting Greeson out of the back seat of my patrol car, I reiterated what Sgt Rodriguez had said about contraband in the detention center, affording Greeson of the opportunity to declare anything. Greeson did not declare anything.

I took Greeson upstairs into the detention center where we were greeted by Monroe County Deputy Sergeant Grimm. Dep Sgt Grimm began to search Greeson, turning his pockets inside out. With Greeson's right front pocket lining completely exposed I say what appeared to be plastic stuck in the pocket lining. I immediately activated my body worn camera. I pointed out to Dep Sgt Grimms the plastic, shinning my flashlight on the area. Dep Sgt Grimms manipulated the area and a small plastic baggie containing a white powdery substance fell out onto the floor (identical to the two that were discovered on Greeson's person at the scene). I photographed the evidence while deputies took charge of Greeson. The photograph was submitted to Evidence.com via AXON Capture.

I gave the small plastic baggie containing a white powdery substance to Ofc Hernandez who also happened to be at the detention center. Ofc Hernandez took the evidence to police headquarters, 1604 North Roosevelt Ave, where it field tested positive for cocaine, with a weight of 0.6 grams.

Sgt Rodriguez later informed me that the two small plastic baggies containing a white powdery substance field tested positive for cocaine, with a combined weight of 1.2 grams.

My BWC was activated during this incident and submitted to Evidence.com.

Based on the facts and evidence, I believe there is probable cause that on 09/04/2022, John Paul Greeson did knowingly and intentionally violate F.S.S. 893.13(6)(a) Drugs-Possess Controlled Substance, by being in actual possession of 1.2 grams of a white powdery substance that field tested positive for cocaine.

Based on the facts and evidence, I believe there is probable cause that on 09/04/2022, John Paul Greeson did knowingly and intentionally violate F.S.S. 951.22 (1)(h) Contraband Articles in County Detention Facilities, by knowingly and willfully, physically possessing and introducing upon the grounds of The Monroe County Detention Center, a small plastic baggie containing a white powdery substance that later field tested positive for cocaine, with a weight of 0.6 grams.

Based on the facts and evidence, I believe there is probable cause that on 09/04/2022, John Paul Greeson committed the act of trespassing, in violation of FSS 810.08 by willfully entering and remaining inside the General Horseplay, 423 Caroline Street, without being authorized or invited after being asked multiple times by the establishment's employees to leave the premises as he was no longer welcomed there.

Based on the facts and evidence, I believe there is probable cause that on 09/04/2022, John Paul Greeson committed the act of resisting an officer without violence, in violation of FSS 843.02, by opposing myself, Officer E. Andrade, of the Key West Police Department, while in my Class B duty uniform in the performance of my legal duties, by pulling away from me, tensing his body and arms in an attempt to break free of my grasp, and not obeying my commands to stop as I directed several times.

Based on the facts and evidence, I believe there is probable cause that on 09/04/2022, John Paul Greeson committed the act of disorderly conduct, in violation of FSS 877.03, by harassing fellow patrons who wished no communication

with him, and shouting loudly and aggressively at employees of General Horseplay, 423 Caroline Street, when asked to leave by employees, causing a scene and affecting the peace and enjoyment of people in the area witnessing him, disrupting the establishments mood, and corrupting public morals and outraging the sense of public decency.
