On Monday September 5, 2022, at about 0107 hours, I, (Ofc. L. Hernandez), was on foot patrol at the 200 block of Duval Street. Ofc. Samuel Adorno, Ofc. Roy Owens and I, were flagged down by staff of Rick's Bar at 202 Duval Street, reference a male that needed to be trespassed from the estalishment.

Upon arrival, we met with the male, later identified as Douglas Edward Venhaus (DOB 12/04/1969) (Arrestee). Venhaus had been asked to leave by Rick's management and security staff and he was refusing to. We made contact with Venhaus at the far end bar called Dirty Harrys of the establishment. We told Venhaus he was being asked to leave and that he needed to. Venhaus was clearly under the influence of alcoholic intoxicant (s) as per his strong odor of alcoholic beverages emanating from his breath and person, slurred speech, glassy and watery and bloodshot eyes, and unsteady walk.

Vanhaus was arguing and being belligerent while still inside the establishment. When we made it to the entrance of the establishment Venhaus was still being belligerent and was coming towards us as we kept telling him to walk away. While walking in rapid and in an attacking manner Venhaus began to scream at us using verbal profanities. I warned Vanhaus he was going to be the subject of arrest for disorderly conduct if he did not walk away. Vanhaus moved in towards me at about 2-3 feet away while yelling at me. I unholstered my tasered and pointed at him while telling him to get back and walk away. Vanhaus was being pulled away by a male friend but became loose and began to come towards me again. I reached out to try to detain Vanhaus and he tried to run away. Ofc. S. Adorno, an employee of Rick's later identified as Raymundo Murillo Acedera (DOB 03/15/1985) (Witness), and I grabbed Vanhaus and he actively resisted by tensing up and trying to pull away from us. We brought Vanhaus down to the ground in a control manner. As we were taking Vanhaus down to the ground I still had my taser unholsted and I accidentally deployed my taser making contact with Ofc. Roy Owens genital area. Ofc. Roy Owens was conscious, alert, and uninjured. Vanhaus kept trying to defeat our attempts of placing him in handcuffs by tensing up and keeping his arms under him. Ofc. Randolph Ham gained control of Vanhaus right arm. Vanhaus tried to use his legs as leverage so we could not detain him. I kept giving loud and clear commands to Vanhaus to get on his belly and comply. I tried to get Vanhaus to comply after his continued resistance by utilizing pain compliance. The pain compliance I used was controlled elbow strikes to Vanhaus' lat muscles on his back and knee spikes to his oblique muscles on the left side of his body. We were finally able to place Vanhaus in handcuffs, I checked them for tightness and double locked them.

Ofc. S. adorno and I walked Vanhaus to my patrol vehicle where I conducted an incident to arrest search of his person and then I placed him in the rear of my patrol vehicle, Axon Fleet rear camera activated. We contacted our watch supervisors, Sgt. David Kouri and Sgt. Alex Rodriguez to respond to the scene to conduct a response to resistance investigation. Sgt. D. Kouri and Sgt. A. Rodriguez arrived and completed their RRI. Vanhaus was actively resisting, and his level of resistance had to be met with ta reasonable and necessary response to prevent the risk of harming himself, ourselves and othes. I transported Vanhaus to the Monroe County Detention Center where he was turned over to the Detention Deputies without issues.

Based on all facts, evidence, and totality of circumstances, I believe we have probable cause Vanhaus committed the misdemeanor criminal offense of trespassing, failed to leave property when ordered by owner as defined in FSS 810.09-2B - Vanhaus was defying the order he was given to leave the establishment by property management.

Based on all facts, evidence, and totality of circumstances, I believe we have probable cause Vanhaus committed the misdemeanor criminal offense of resisting an officer to his / her person without violence as defined in FSS 843.02 -Vanhaus obstructed us from our lawful duty during a lawful detainment and subsequent arrest by actively resisting. Vanhaus tried to flee the scene when he was being told he was being detained. Vanhaus actively tried to defeat our attempts of placing him in handcuffs by tensing up and keeping his arms under him and using the bending of his legs as leverage to avoid arrest.

On September 5, 2022, at approximately 0105 hours, Ofc. Hernandez and I (Ofc. Adorno) were flagged down at Ricks Bar (202 Duval St) to attend the rear at Durty Harrys reference a trespasser.

Upon arrival, we observed the security team at Ricks guiding a male individual toward the front of the establishment. While we assisted Ricks security team, the male individual continued to act belligerent, turn toward the employees and officers, yelling to not touch him. As the male was removed off the property, he continued to take several steps toward Ofc. Hernandez and myself in an aggressive manner. The male was advised several times to turn around and walk away. The male, later identified as Venhaus, continued to act and talk in an aggressive manner and attacking manner, flaring his hands approximately 2 feet away from Ofc. Hernandez and my self's face. Venhaus continued to approach us as we gave him several other warnings to walk away and go home. It should be noted, it was clear Venhaus was intoxicated, he had an odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his breath, slurred speech, was unbalanced, and had glassy and watery eyes. After numerous of warnings, Venhaus continued to step toward the officers. As Venhaus approached us again, Ofc. Hernandez unholstered his taser and advised him to walk away due to his aggression. Venhaus had two other friends on scene who tried multiple times to pull him away, with Venhaus ripping away from them and continuing to become aggressive with officers on scene. After several warnings, Ofc. Hernandez advised Venhaus to turn around and place his hands behind him. Venhaus began to resist and tense his hands, trying to pull them away. Venhaus then attempted to run away at this time. A Ricks employee jumped onto his back, as I reached out and grabbed Venhaus, guiding him to the floor in a controlled manner. As Ofc. Hernandez assisted in the take down, Ofc. Hernandez still had his taser unholstered and accidentally deployed his taser and made contact with Ofc. Owens genital area. As Venhaus was on the floor, he tried to utilize his legs to keep himself from laying on his stomach. At this moment, I grabbed both of Venhaus's legs and pulled them outwards. At this time, we were able to place him in handcuffs and place him in the rear of Ofc. Hernandez vehicle.

On 09/05/2022 at 0107, Ofc. S. Adorno, Ofc. L. Hernandez and I (Ofc. R Owens), were flagged down by Ricks staff for a trespass.

Upon arrival to Ricks Bar in the back in Dirty Harry's, an unidentified white male was being told he had to leave the property. The subject later identified as, Douglas Venhaus, argued with Ricks staff and Ofc. Hernandez about leaving. Ofc. Hernandez told Venhaus to leave the property and not to come back. Venhaus turned towards Ofc. Hernandez and I, two or three times continuing to argue. When Venhaus was removed from the property Ofc. Hernandez told him numerous times to walk away and not come back onto the property and displayed his TASER. I told Venhaus at least two times to walk away and leave and Venhaus refused to leave. Venhaus started to walk away and came back to Ofc. Hernandez stating, he (Venhaus) was a lawyer and an insurance agent. Ofc. Hernandez told Venhaus to leave, or he was going to be arrested for disorderly conduct. Before Ofc. Hernandez was able to secure his TASER, Venhaus approached Ofc. Hernandez again. Ofc. Hernandez appeared to pull out his handcuffs to place Venhaus under arrest when Venhaus turned and attempted to run. In my view, Ofc. Hernandez and Ofc. Adorno appeared to grab Venhaus to take control of him. Venhaus resisted officers' orders to release his hands and lay on his stomach. Ofc. Hernandez delivered strikes with his elbow to Venhaus' back at which point Ofc. Hernandez TASER accidentally discharged in my direction. The TASER prongs hit me in my left leg and my left testicle. I pulled the TASER prong out of my left leg and the second prong did not penetrate skin. I stood up and Venhaus was in custody. Venhaus was escorted to Ofc. Hernandez's patrol vehicle and searched incident to arrest.

My AXON BWC was activated for this incident. I had no further involvement in this incident.
