-- Bricria Maylin Moreno Deleon Arrest Narrative:

On Monday, February 27, 2023, at approximately 6:55 pm., I (Ofc. L. Carr), Ofc. K. Bouvier and Ofc. J. we were approached by the victim, Yirobys Raul Toledo (DOB 5/18/1981.) He appeared to be upset and his shirt was torn. He used a combination of English and Spanish to explain what was happening. Based on his statements It appeared he may have been involved in a Domestic dispute.

Ofc. Hesse stood by with Toledo while Ofc. Bouvier and I attempted to located DeLeon at the Mobile station, we were unable to locate her. Ofc. Hesse then advised DeLeon was standing at his location. DeLeon appeared agitated and was yelling at Toledo.

DeLeon refused to comply with request to move away from Toledo and continued to yell at him. Officers Bouvier and Hesse redirected her away from Toledo by placing a hand on her shoulder and motioning for her to move away. DeLeon refused to move and began to tense and pull away from the Officers. She then sat down on the sidewalk and began kicking at Ofc. Bouvier, Hesse and me. DeLeon kicked me on my left shin. I grabbed Deleon's ankles to prevent her from kicking me again. DeLeon continued to resist our efforts to place her in handcuffs. We rolled her onto her stomach to handcuff her. After she was placed into handcuffs, we then rolled her off her stomach, stood her up and placed her in my patrol vehicle.

Toledo and DeLeon speak primarily Spanish. Ofc. E Andrade was requested to respond to the scene to provide translation.

Toledo told Ofc. Andrade he was parked at the Mobile station (3228 Flagler Avenue). He said he and his girlfriend, Bricria Maylin Moreno DeLeon (DOB 5/21/2004) had been dating for 11 months. Toledo said they had been arguing all day because he wanted to break up with DeLeon. Toledo said they had driven to the Mobile station so he could buy some water. While sitting in the parked vehicle the couple continued to argue. When Toledo said he had enough of her and just wanted to be rid of her, DeLeon physically pushed Toledo in his chest then grabbed his shirt and tore it at the left shoulder. There was a fresh scratch on Toledo's neck near his torn shirt.

DeLeon confirmed they had been dating for 11 months. She said Toledo wanted to break up with her because she had cheated on him in the past. She stated they had been arguing all day. While parked at the Mobile station she said she was sitting on top of the center console, as they continued to argue. To console Toledo, she had reached out to hold his hands. When Toledo pulled away, DeLeon admitted to hitting Toledo and grabbing his shirt to not fall off the console.

I believe DeLeon, by striking then tearing Toledo's shirt, intentionally touched or struck Toledo against his will. DeLeon also intentionally caused bodily harm to Toledo by scratching his neck. DeLeon is in violation of FSS 784.03 (1A1).

I also believe DeLeon knowingly and willfully resisted and obstructed with violence, by pulling away from and kicking at Officers, in violation of FSS 843.01. At the time we were in full uniform and engaged in the lawful execution of our legal duty.

Sgt. A. Rodriguez arrived on scene and completed a RRI report. DeLeon complained of an abrasion to her left forehead and soreness in her left elbow and neck. She was transported by me to Lower Keys Medical Center for evaluation. She was cleared by medical staff and then transported to Monroe County Detention Center without

On Monday, February 27, 2023 at approximately 1854hrs, I Ofc. J. Hesse was in the area of 3316 Flagler Ave along with Ofc's Carr and Bouvier on an unrelated call for service. While at the location officers were approached by a male subject who indicated he was involved in some sort of altercation with his girlfriend while at the Mobil gas station, located at 3228 Flagler Ave, approximately 1/2 block to the west.

Due to an initial Spanish/English language barrier, it was unclear what events had transpired, however I did note the male's shirt collar was torn and he indicated "yes" when I asked if it was due to the altercation with his girlfriend. Ofc. Andrade was requested to the scene to assist with translation between the subjects and officers.

The male subject indicated to officers that his girlfriend was still at the gas station in a gray minivan. While awaiting the arrival of Ofc. Andrade, Ofc's Carr and Bouvier walked to the location to contact the female half. I activated my Axon BWC at that time. As I stayed with the male, I saw a female approaching our position and asked the male if it was his girlfriend and he indicated it was.

I walked towards the female to maintain separation between the two and told her to walk the other direction and she stopped walking but did not turn around. I attempted to physically guide her further away from the male and she immediately exerted force with her right arm against the resistance I was applying to her arm. At that time, due to the absence of other officers I broke physical contact with the female and stood in her line of sight of the male. She did not make any further attempts to get closer to the male, however she did try to yell to him a couple time which were quickly stopped.

When Ofc. Carr and Ofc. Bouvier returned to my position, Ofc. Bouvier again ordered the female to walk further away from the male and she refused. When Ofc. Bouvier attempted to guide her movement by exerting force against her right arm, she immediately resisted. Ofc. Bouvier took control of her right arm to redirect her she threw her body weight rearward and turned with her back towards me. I took control of her left wrist and bicep, and she then dropped her weight to the ground into a seated position. Ofc. Bouvier and myself attempted to lift the female back to her feet while she screamed "NO!" and would not place any weight onto her feet.

The female then began flailing her legs and attempting to pull her arms free from officers' grasp and in towards her body. While attempting to get her into a standing position, she began kicking her feet out directly towards Ofc. Carr. At that time, I believed the female to be actively resisting arrest while using violence in the course of her action.

While the female continued to apply resistance against officers' actions, Ofc. Bouvier was able to maneuver the female from a supine position to a prone position to allow handcuffs to be applied. The handcuffs were applied and double locked. After the handcuffs were applied, checked for proper fit, and double locked, the female was immediately brought to a standing position and assessed for any major injuries, to which I observed none.

On Monday February 27, 2023, at approximately, 6:55 PM, I, Ofc. K. Bouvier and two other officers were approached by a Latin male in the 3300 Block of Flagler Ave. as we were clearing a separate call.

The man was later identified as Yiroby Toledo, DOB 05/18/1981. Mr. Toledo's primary language is Spanish, however he was able to articulate his situation with enough English that I and the other officers were able to understand that he was involved in a domestic altercation and that the other half of the domestic altercation was across the street at the Mobile Gas Station. I observed that Mr. Toledo's shirt was ripped at the collar, and he had what appeared to be a fresh red scratch on the left side of his neck.

Ofc. L. Carr and I went to the gas station in an attempt to make contact with the other half of the altercation, however she had already left the gas station and was out with Ofc. J. Hesse and Mr. Toledo. Ofc. J. Hesse informed us over the radio that he was out with the other half of the altercation. As Ofc. L. Carr and I approached Ofc. J. Hesse and the female half of the altercation I could hear Ofc. J. Hesse telling the woman to step away from Mr. Toledo. The female, who was later identified as Bricia DeLeon, DOB 05/21/2004, was refusing to comply with Ofc. J. Hesse's multiple requests to step away from Mr. Toledo. I then asked Ms. DeLeon to step away and she refused. I asked Ms. DeLeon to step away from Mr. Toledo again and she refused. I then placed a hand on Ms. DeLeon's shoulder, and repeated my request for her to move away from Mr. Toledo and motioned in the direction I wanted her to walk. Ms. DeLeon refused to walk and pushed back against my hand, at which point I transitioned to take hold of Ms. DeLeon's arm. Ms. DeLeon began yelling at Mr. Toledo while she was pulling, pushing and eventually refused to stand altogether, laying her body on the ground and kicking in an attempt to defeat my effort to walk her away from the victim. As Ms. DeLeon was resisting Ofc. J. Hesse took control of Ms. DeLeon's other arm. While Ms. DeLeon was on the ground Ofc. L. Carr took control of her legs while Ofc. J. Hesse and I placed Ms. DeLeon into handcuffs. Once in handcuffs Ms. DeLeon calmed down enough to be assisted to her feet and walked over to a patrol car where she placed inside.

Ms. DeLeon complained that her head, neck and left arm were hurting as a result of the response to her resistance. Because of Ms. DeLeon's complaint of injury, Sgt. A. Rodriguez responded to the scene to conduct interviews for the RRI.

Ms. DeLeon was subsequently arrested for Battery on Mr. Toledo and for resisting Officers with violence. Ms. DeLeon was transported to Lower Keys Medical Center for clearance and then transported the Monroe County Detention Center, where she was turned over to detention staff without incident.

My KWPD issued Body-Cam was activated during this call. It should be noted that during the struggle with Ms. DeLeon my Body-Cam was knocked off of my uniform and fell to the sidewalk.
