FROM: Karen DeMaria, City of Key West Urban Forestry Manager

An application was submitted for Landscape Plan Approval for the above referenced property, the Casa Marina. There is no tree removal involved with this review. Thirty-two palms are proposed to be removed (26-Sabal Palms, 5-Washingtonian Palms, and 1-Date Palm) and seventeen palms (10-Coconut and 7-Sabal Palms) will be transplanted.

The Casa Marina is proposing to do construction work to improve and maintain the existing facilities. Protected palms to be transplanted are due to new construction. Unprotected but regulated palms to be removed are to improve and enhance the landscape, and protected palms along Seminole Street are to be removed and replaced because they are causing damage to the building façade.

The proposed landscape plan will enhance the existing areas within the hotel property and enhance the entrance corner area. The request to remove the Sabal Palms along Seminole Street against the building is a reasonable request. The plan proposes to replant with (13) Thatch palms in this area where (26) Sabal Palms are being removed. Discussions are still ongoing regarding possible additional improvements to the Seminole Street area to include the city right of way area.









SITEMAP: Palm Impact Areas
