A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO DEFEAT HB 1317/SB 1346, WHICH, AMONG ITS PROVISIONS, WOULD PROHIBIT LOCAL GOVERNMENTS FROM PREVENTING THE DEMOLITION OF CERTAIN STRUCTURES WITHIN A HALF MILE OF THE COASTLINE, AND REQUIRE LOCAL GOVERNMENT TO AUTHORIZE REPLACEMENT STRUCTURES AΤ THE MAXMIMUM DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL ALLOWED BY LOCAL DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS; DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO PROVIDE THIS RESOLUTION CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, Florida House Bill 1317 and Florida Senate Bill 1346 propose to prohibit local governments from preventing the demolition of most structures within a half mile of a coastline, and further to allow development of replacement structures to the maximum potential allowed by local development regulations; and

WHEREAS, the City of Key West would be severely impacted by such legislation. A substantial segment of buildings and structures, including nearly all of the "Old Town" historic district, are located within a half mile of a coastline; and

WHEREAS, the language of these proposed bills would grant developers authority to demolish almost every commercial and mixed-use structure in Key West, and replace them with structures of size and capacity that would effectively erase the historic charm and significance of the island; and

WHEREAS, although the proposed bills do not rescind development regulations such as BPAS, which restricts the number of new housing units that can be developed, it is clear that unfettered redevelopment of buildings within a half mile of the shores of Key West would increase the number of people occupying those buildings, and increase demand on Key West's critical infrastructure including water, sewer, traffic and parking; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that HB 1317/SB 1346 would have an adverse effect on the health, safety and welfare of visitors and residents of the City of Key West; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the Key West City Commission urges the Florida Legislature to defeat House Bill 1317/SB 1346, which effectively removes local restrictions on demolition and redevelopment of structures within a half mile of coastline.

Section 2: That the City Clerk is hereby authorized to
transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to Governor Ron
DeSantis, Representative Roach (HB Sponsor), House Speaker Paul
Renner, and Representative James "Jim" Mooney, Jr, Senator Avila
(SB 1346 Sponsor), and Senator Ana Maria Rodriguez.
Section 3: That this Resolution shall go into effect
immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by
the signature of the Presiding Officer and the Clerk of the
Commission.
