An application was received requesting the removal of **(1) Black Olive tree**. A site inspection was done on February 24, 2017 and documented the following:

Tree Species: Black Olive (Bucida buceras)






Diameter: 26.4" - 24" (not regulated) = 2.4" regulated

Location: 80% (front yard tree)

Species: 0% (on not protected tree list)

Condition: 70% (fair to good) Total Average Value = 50%


Value x Diameter = 1.2 replacement caliper inches

NOTE: From the IFAS publication: "The inconspicuous, small, greenish-yellow flowers are produced in 4-inch-long spikes during spring and summer and eventually form the black fruits which, unfortunately, exude a staining tannic acid material which could damage patios, sidewalks, or vehicles parked below." Property owner is having an issue with the staining damaging private property.

Recommendation: Recommend approval of the removal of one (1) Black Olive tree at 1111 16th Terrace to be replaced with 1.2 caliper inches of dicot or fruit trees from approved list, FL#1, to be planted on site.

I am writing to give to the board some of the reasons that we wish to remove the large black olive tree in my front yard. It was planted shortly after the house was purchased. at that time, my two gires were todalers. They are now 43 and 45. I will be 70 this year and my husband will be 73. She tree is much larger than I ever expected, and yes as Kens King stated, it is a durty, messy true for me and my 2 adjoining meighbors I had accepted the staining that the tree ded to my dreveway, sidewalk and wall. If a can was parked under the tree it too would be stained My immediate neighbor has a carport very close to the property line and she placed pavers in the front yard, Her property gets as much debies from the tree, as my front yard. I feel obliged to clean her carport, powers, sidwalk, and the street in front of her house.

My house has its original falouse windows, I make lefe easier and feel more protected, I deceded to start replacing the windows with hurricane impact windows, I started with the largest windows which was the furthest

away from the tree, after several weeks, I moticed that the caulking had turned getter and brown. The installers insisted that it was not the caulking, but the tree. They scraped a layer of the caulking out and replaced it with new caulking. There are more wondows in the first that I wish to uplace with hiricane impact windows but they are directly under the tree. They will be trashed. The cost of turnining the tree yearly is \$700.00 plus a year, and as it grows so will the trimming fee the installers will not come after every wondy rainfall. I am now impacted negotively by this tree.

My back yard is planted with several flowering trees, colorfee anotons, hibixus a variety of aralias, palms, forms, and a very large and magnificent lignum vitae that was plated shortly after moving in.
