MR. CINTRON: I am Robert Cintron and I want to thank you for taking time to come down here in this situation which I understand you are not real happy about it because your name has been in the newspaper and, you know, we apologize for that.

It's sometimes the unfortunate result of things that you have no control over, so your being here today will help the CRB conclude this case.

You're here voluntarily. You don't have to be here.

If, at any time, you feel uncomfortable and you want to stop, you control this. Okay. So I don't want you to feel like this is a star chamber proceeding or that you have to participate. And I mean that very seriously because I want this to be an experience that you won't leave feeling poorly about the Citizens Review Board.

So after having said that, this court reporter is taking down everything that is said verbatim. Okay. And when we're concluded she is going to type it up and it will be presented to the Citizen Review Board members so that they can review it and have additional information about this pending case. Is it Wirkner?

A Wirkner.

Q Mr. Wirkner, what I want to do is walk through this night that this occurred from the beginning until the end so to speak.

So, if you would be kind enough I want to go back in time to the first point in time when you had any interaction with this fellow by the name of Binns. So tell me what you recall was the first time that you had any interaction with him.

A Well, I was on a scooter and I pulled out onto Truman at Watson Street and he was in front of me going about ten miles an hour. He veered over to the right-hand side. I passed him. I thought he was going to turn into Dions or something. He pulled up to the light next to me at Truman and White and proceeded to call me faggot and say, "why did you pass me, faggot?"

- Q Okay. Stop right there because you started this at a good point. So you came off of Watson Street on your scooter.

 Frank Blasberg.
- 8 Q Who is he?

- A He is in the police department.
- 10 Q Do you know Mr. Blasberg?
- 11 A He is a friend of mine.
- 12 Q He is a police officer. He is a friend of yours?
- A Yes, and then I called Todd Stevens another friend of mine.
- 15 Q Is he a police officer?
- 16 A Yes.
- 17 Q What do you do for a living?
- 18 A I clean houses.
 - Q Okay. So it was after you heard Mr. Binns apparently making a 911 call that you first called Officer Blasberg and then you later called Officer Stevens?
- 22 A Right. One of them I got a machine.
- 23 Q Okay.
- A And the other one I didn't. I can't remember -- you have to understand I was shocked.

1 Do you recall which of the two officers you ended up 2 speaking to? 3 A Todd. Officer Stevens. 5 A Yes. 6 And do you remember the substance of that conversation? I told him what happened and that the guy was outside 7 8 lying to 911 and he calmed me down. That took quite awhile and I looked outside again and the police were there. 10 Q Okay. 11 And at that point he said -- Todd said go out and talk 12 to the police because I didn't want to go out there with that 13 guy there and he said go out and talk to the police. I'll stav 14 on the phone with you. Okay. Did Officer Stevens -- did he speak with any of 15 the officers by phone to your knowledge? 16 17 A No. 18 No. 19 A No. 20 Okay. Did Officer Stevens indicate to you while you were on the phone with him that he would do what he could to 21 22 intervene or assist or he anything like that? 23 A No. 24 So he was just basically helping you through this

difficult time as a friend?

- 1 A Yes.
- 2 Q Correct?
- 3 A Yes.

- Q All right. Did you see any off the interaction between Mr. Binns and Officer Rodriguez who was the investigating officer?
- A When I came out and Officer Rodriguez came up to me Mr. Binns approached us saying I don't know what. I don't know what he was saying. Just nonsense.
- Q Officer Rodriguez said would you go wait over there. There was another officer there at that point a little farther away.
- A Right. And he sent him back over there so Officer Rodriguez could talk to me.
 - Q Okay.
- A And I just told him what happened. Very short and very plain and I mean I am still covered with blood. It was pretty apparent to everyone concerned that I was not the guy who started this fight.
- Q Okay. Did you end up having to go to get medical care either that evening or --
- A Yes. Officer Rodriguez strongly advised me to let him call the paramedics for me. I was reluctant but they came and I had a huge gash on my forehead which was blood everywhere and there was some question of whether I needed stitches or not.

- The paramedics cleaned me up a bit and then advised that I should go to the hospital and make sure I didn't need stitches so there wouldn't be a scar. And I had a one of my roommates take me to the hospital.
- Q So you did end up going to the hospital and did you have to have stitches?
 - A No.

- Q I can tell you there is no scar.
- A I am pretty happy about that. It took a while.
- Q I don't want to put you on the spot and I don't want to imply anything by this question, but it's important for me to ask, okay, because Mr. Binns has indicated that he feels as if he was not treated fairly because you knew some police officers and the implication being that somehow they interceded on your behalf to his disadvantage. And that is why I was asking you about these phone calls and, you know, I don't want you to assume by my questions that I agree with that. I just need to ask. Okay.
- So please don't be offended by those questions. So I want to go through this one more time with you as it relates to Officer Stevens and Officer Blasberg. Is he an officer or detective, Blasberg or you don't know?
- A I don't know.
- Q You're sure that you only spoke with one of the two officers that you called, correct? You called Blasberg and you

called Stevens, correct? 2 Right. A And you got, I guess you got Blasberg's answering --3 I believe so. But you don't believe that you spoke with Blasberg? 5 No. I think I just left a message on the machine. 6 A 7 Did he call back at some point in time; he being Blasberg? 8 9 It seems like I did speak to him. He may have called 10 afterwards and I told him what happened. I think that is right 11 but I didn't talk to him for very long at all. 12 Would that have been that same night? 13 Yes. Perhaps after I had come back inside. 14 Okay. 0 15 Maybe before. I am unsure of the time line. A So you think you did speak with Blasberg eventually? 16 17 Yeah, he called me back. Otherwise I would be mad. A Не did call me back. 18 19 And then you know you spoke with Officer Stevens? 20 A Yes. 21 And when Officer Stevens recommended that you go 22 outside when the police arrived outside did you terminate your 23 call with Officer Stevens or did you leave him on the line?

Okay. Did he, Officer Stevens communicate with Officer

I left him on the line.

Rodriguez on the phone to any extent? 1 A No. 2 So Officer Stevens -- was he listening in on the 3 interaction between you --4 Yes. 5 A Okay. And was he on the phone the entire time while 6 7 you are talking to Officer Rodriguez, he being Officer Stevens? 8 A Yes. 9 Okay. What was your reason for doing that? Why did you feel the need to keep him on the phone? 10 I did not want to go outside at all and deal with any 11 A of it. 12 All right. But explain to me if you have an 13 explanation why you thought it would be helpful to keep Officer 14 15 Stevens on the phone while you are going out to talk to --That was his way of him getting me to actually go out 16 A there. He was trying to get me out there. 17 So he was giving you some comfort by staying on the 18 line? 19 20 A Yes. Okay. And he was able, he Officer Stevens was he at 21 least able to hear your side of the conversation with Officer 22 23 Rodriguez but he never got on the phone and spoke with Officer

25 A No.

Rodriguez?

1 When you were finished with you interaction with Officer Rodriguez you went back into your home. 2 A Yes. 3 Okay. And was Officer Stevens still on the phone? For a short period. He said call me back later if you 5 need me. Okay. To your knowledge did Officer Stevens ever reach 7 8 out to Officer Rodriguez or any of the other officers who arrived that evening to discuss the case? 10 A No. 11 So you never heard that they did that or you don't know 12 that they did? 13 No. A Okay. Let's stop for just a second. 14 0 (Brief pause.) 15 16 BY MR. CINTRON: 17 From what you observed how would you describe Officer Rodriguez's interaction with Mr. Binns during the time that you 18 were present and they were interacting? 19 20 Perfectly professional and neutral. 21 Okay. Did you observe any aggressiveness or behavior 0 on behalf of Mr. Binns towards Officer Rodriguez? 22 23 He was belligerent. A 24 Okay. He being? 0 25 A Binns.

Q Binns. Okay. Anything else? Okay. This will conclude the statement and I appreciate your coming down and I have to tell you that this statement is going to be given to the other board members, so it will be public to that extent and I know the last thing you want is your name in the paper anymore and we'll do what we can to prevent that, but we can't control

And I just realized that I don't think we put him under oath.

MICHAEL WIRKNER

Do you swear that the testimony you are about to give and the testimony you have given thus far has been the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth.

THE WITNESS: I do.

it. Okay.

Q Is there anything you want to add to this? I should have given you that opportunity. I want to give you an opportunity, if there is anything you want to say to the Citizens Review Board about this incident. That way you get to share your view of anything that relates to this matter so that you feel like you have had your opportunity to say your piece so your welcome to --

A Just that Officer Rodriguez was perfectly professional throughout the entire thing. And including what I saw of his interaction with Mr. Binns and there is absolutely no reason for this.

Q Okay. All right. Well, listen I appreciate you coming down. This has been helpful. I promise you it wasn't a waste of time, okay? Because one of the things we insist on at the Citizens Review Board is that when someone files a complaint that it gets thoroughly investigated so that we can make sure whatever decision is made is made based upon all of the information available. So because you were involved in this, it's necessary to get your input and I am sorry that you had to be put through this, but it's been very helpful and it was not a waste of time.

A I hope so.

Q So enjoy the rest of your evening. Enjoy your Easter. Thank you for coming, ma'am, and I hope that you don't have any more problems like this.

A Let's hope so.
