Whereas, suicide is the only leading cause of death in the United States that has increased every for the past decade; and

Whereas, in 2017, Florida experienced 3187 suicide deaths; and

Whereas, in 2017, Monroe County, experienced 20 suicide deaths; and

Whereas, in 2018, we have seen a rise in the number of suicide deaths and the stigma associated with mental health conditions and suicide works against prevention by discouraging persons at risk for suicide from seeking lifesaving help; and

Whereas, organizations such as The American Foundation for Suicide Prevention are dedicated to saving lives and bringing hope to those affected by suicide, through research education, advocacy and resources for those who have lost or struggle
