RE: **1615 Washington Street (permit application # T2018-0012)**

FROM: Karen DeMaria, City of Key West Urban Forestry Manager

An application was received requesting the transplanting of **(2) Royal Poinciana trees**. A site inspection determined that the trees were in poor structural condition and not good candidates for transplanting. The property owner then requested approval to remove the trees.

Tree Species: Royal Poinciana (*Delonix regia*)

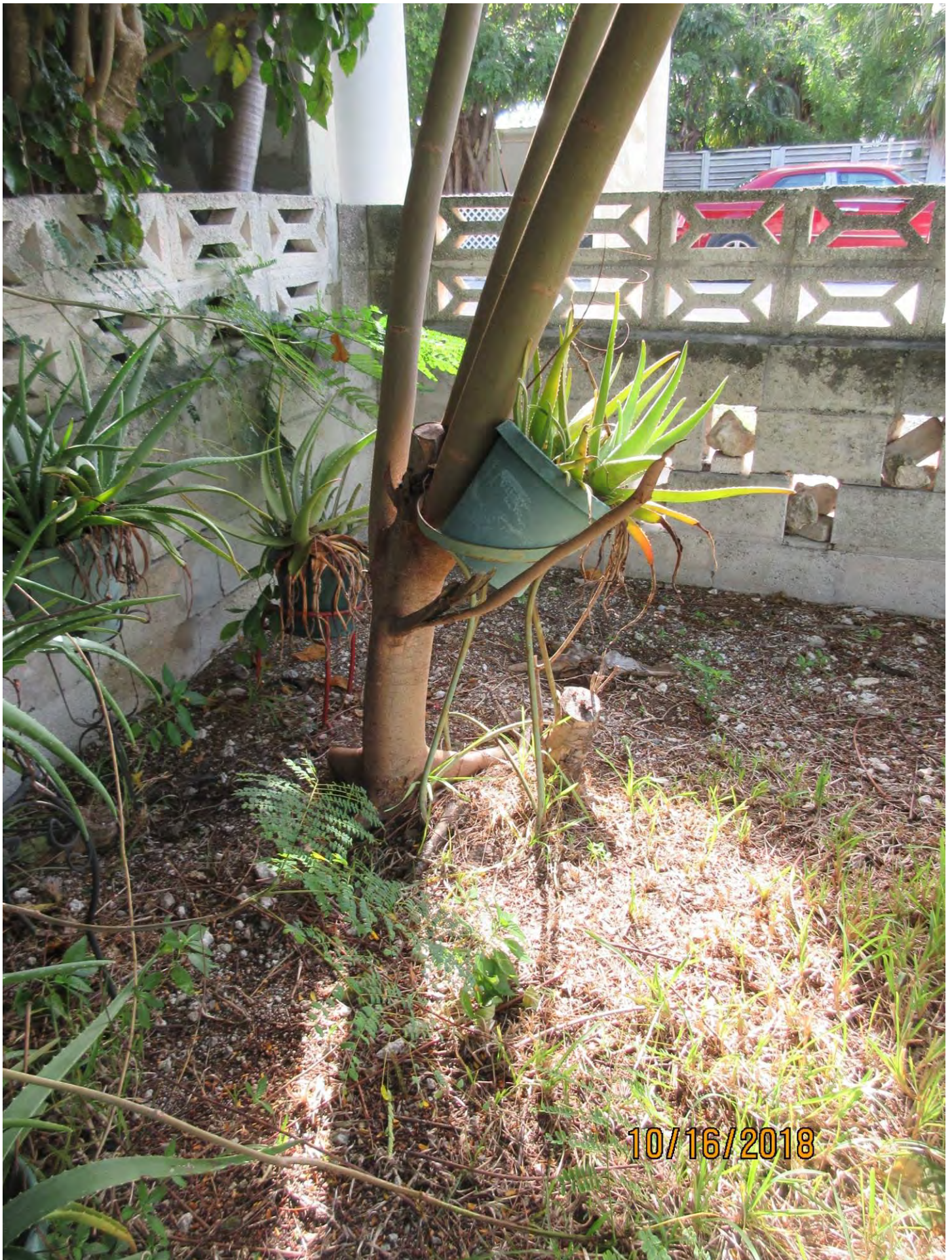

Tree #1: Diameter: 8.5"

Location: 60% (close to fence area, not a lot of room for future growth)

Species: 100% (on protected tree list)

Condition: 40% (poor, old cuts, most of the growth is regrowth off a stump, poor structure)

Total Average Value = 66%

Value x Diameter = 5.6 replacement caliper inches

Tree #2: Diameter: 14.9"

Location: 60% (growing against fence wall, not a lot of room for future growth)

Species: 100% (on protected tree list)

Condition: 40% (poor, old cuts, most of growth is regrowth off a stump, poor structure)

Total Average Value = 66%

Value x Diameter = 15.4 replacement caliper inches

Recommendation: Recommend approval of the removal of two (2) Royal Poinciana trees at 1615 Washington Street to be replaced with a total of 21 caliper inches of dicot or fruit trees from approved list, FL#1, to be planted on site.

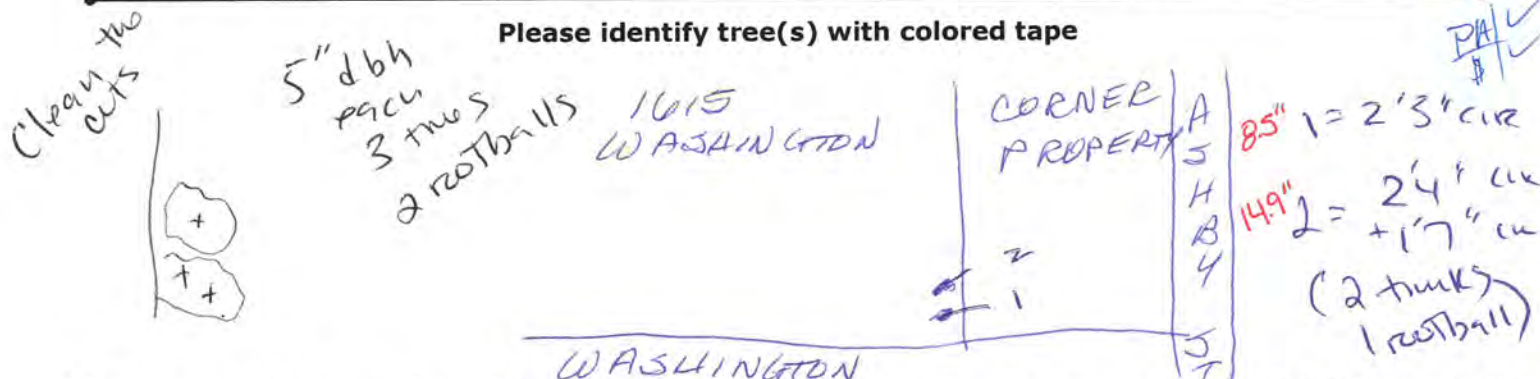

Margaret:

Regarding your application to transplant the two Royal Poinciana trees along the right side property line. I am not sure the trees would survive being transplanted. There are two rootballs with one rootball (#2) being a double trunk very close to the property line concrete wall/fence. Also, both tree groups are not in good condition as they are both regrowths with long, leggy trunks growing off old cut areas. If you really want to transplant the trees, you would need to hire someone who knows how to do so properly as survivability is a requirement, and I would want them to stay on your property not donated to St. Mary's.

If you want to remove the trees, please let me know and I can place this item on the Nov 13 Tree Commission agenda.
