AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 18 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES ENTITLED "BUSINESSES" BY AMENDING ARTICLE VI ENTITLED "MOBILE VENDORS", SECTION 18 - 325"TRANSFERABILITY" TO AFFORD EQUAL RIGHTS TO REGISTERED DOMESTIC PARTNERS AS PROVIDED FOR SPOUSES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City Commission for the City of Key West has long respected and recognized rights of registered domestic partners; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission for the City of Key West finds that an amendment to Sec. 18-325(c) of the Code of Ordinances is required to permit the transfer of a mobile vendor's license to the surviving domestic partner on the same basis as permitted for a surviving spouse.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA:

<u>Section 1</u>: That Chapter 18-325(c) of the Code of Ordinances is hereby added/amended as follows*:

Sec. 18-325. - Transferability.

(c) Transfer to surviving spouse <u>or registered domestic</u> <u>partner</u>. Upon the death of the holder of an active valid mobile vendor's license, the mobile vendor's license may be transferred to the surviving spouse <u>or registered domestic</u> <u>partner</u> not holding a separate mobile vendor's license. Intent to so transfer must have been documented by the mobile vendor's license holder while still living by means of a will, trust document, or other statement of intent to transfer meeting all statutory requirements for validity at the time of execution. In order to obtain transfer, the surviving spouse <u>or registered domestic partner</u> must make a written request to the city manager within 45 days of the death of the mobile vendor's license holder, accompanied by a copy of the death certificate and a copy of the will, trust document,

*(Coding: Added language is <u>underlined</u>; deleted language is struck through.) or other statement of intent referred to in this subsection. Prior to issuance of the transfer, the surviving spouse or <u>registered domestic partner</u> shall provide the information and payments required by sections 18-318(a)(1) through (8) to the city manager. The surviving spouse <u>or registered domestic</u> partner shall comply with all sections of this article.

<u>Section 2</u>: If any section, provision, clause, phrase, or application of this Ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional for any reason by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable therefrom and shall be construed as reasonable and necessary to achieve the lawful purposes of this Ordinance.

<u>Section 3</u>: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances of said City in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby superseded to the extent of such conflict. Section 4: This Ordinance shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the signature of the presiding officer and the Clerk of the Commission.
