I submitted a Tree Represention Authorization form to you previously to allow discussion of my request to remove a tree in my back yard that has become a hazard since Hurricane Irma.

Ken King (Golden Bough Tree Svcs) can give details on the situation with the tree and the health issues of the tree which most likely worsened during the stress on the tree caused by hurricane Irma, and a neighbor's tree that fell onto this tree, as well as my back porch, roof and electric feed lines to the home.

I just received ownership of this property in April 2018, quickly and unexpectedly as my father became ill and passed away. I do not have the financial resources to be able to plant other trees in my yard but I do need this tree removed as it is definitely a major safety hazard to my family.

The limbs have become weak and snap off in the slightest bit of windy, rain or adverse weather - I worry about my kids safety constantly whenever there's a little rain or wind coming through our area

I have been advised and pre-approved by an assigned disaster case manager that they will pay for removal of this tree, but I need permission from the Tree Commission first? They will not pay for replacement foliage or tree plantings but only the elimination of the safety concern - I've asked?

Please consider this email a request to be exempt from replanting or replacement of additional trees due to these reasons, and my limited financial ability at this time.
