On 6/2/2019, at approximately 2230 hours, I (Sgt. M. Siracuse) was traveling eastbound on the 300 block of Southard Street when I observed a blue KIA four door sedan parked on the north side of the street, facing westbound. I noticed the vehicle appeared to have a lot of items inside, and the driver's seat was fully declined with a white male, later identified as Juan Antonio Sanchez Alonso, whom appeared to be sleeping in the driver's seat.

I pulled my patrol vehicle into the parking lot of the state attorney's office and walked up to the rear of the vehicle. I was wearing my class B KWPD patrol uniform with my full duty belt, badge, gun, etc. exhibited. I contacted KWPD dispatch and advised them I would be out with a suspicious vehicle at that location. I approached the passenger's side window with my flashlight and made contact with Sanchez. Sanchez was immediately confrontational when I introduced myself to him and informed him the reason I was meeting with him. As I looked inside Sanchez's vehicle, it was clear to me Sanchez was residing inside his vehicle. Sanchez had pillows, bags, toiletries, a dog, towels, etc. all inside his vehicle. Furthermore, Sanchez admitted to me he was currently living inside his vehicle. As I explained the City of Key West camping ordinance to Sanchez, he continuously interrupted me and changed his story about living inside the vehicle. Sanchez was also illegally parked in a clearly marked no parking area. There was a sign directly in front of Sanchez's vehicle that read, "No parking anytime, tow away zone."

Sanchez said he was not camping, but was on the phone with his wife, waiting to bring her food because she worked around the corner. Sanchez was on the phone with his wife, who later arrived on scene. I asked Sanchez to provide me his identification. Sanchez refused to provide me his ID and claimed he had not broken any laws. Ofc. Waite arrived on scene and I had to ask Sanchez several times to open his driver's side door to speak to Ofc. Waite. Ofc. Waite attempted to calm down Sanchez, however he continued to be confrontational. After being asked several times, Sanchez got out of the vehicle.

Due to Sanchez's large size (5'11, approximately 350 lbs), and his irate behavior, I asked Sanchez twice to sit on the curb behind his vehicle. Sanchez had still not provided any identification. Sanchez continued yelling at us about how he didn't do anything wrong. Ofc. Waite informed Sanchez he had to follow our lawful orders just based on the parking infraction alone. After the second time Sanchez did not follow my order to sit on the curb behind his vehicle, I deployed OC spray in order to take Sanchez into custody. The OC spray hit Sanchez in the face and he dropped to his knees. Sanchez began yelling and I gave him clear, loud, verbal commands to put his hands behind his back. Sanchez immediately complied and we placed him in handcuffs.

Sgt. P. Rodriguez arrived on scene to complete a RRI report reference the OC spray. KWFD Rescue 2 responded to treat Sanchez and subsequently transported him to the LKMC for medical clearance. Once medically cleared, Officers Waite and Litton transported Sanchez to the MCDC. Sgt. Rodriguez issued Sanchez's vehicle a parking citation and provided it to his wife. Sanchez's vehicle was turned over to his wife.

Both Officers Waite and Haynie informed me they recently dealt with Sanchez reference camping violations and issued him warnings. A check through our CAD system showed Sanchez also received a camping warning on 5/8/2019.

I photographed Sanchez's vehicle, the area he improperly parked, and the indicia of camping located inside Sanchez's vehicle. I uploaded those photos into the Evidence.com server.

Key West City Ordinance 62 - 4. Sanchez used his motor vehicle as a barrier between him and the elements, establishing a habitat within the city of Key West. Sanchez had received warnings reference this ordinance and had multiple camp facilities inside his vehicle. Both Sanchez and his wife also admitted to living inside the vehicle.

Resisting an officer without violence. Sanchez refused to follow lawful commands given to him by sworn officers in the course of their legal duty. These commands included providing identification, exiting the vehicle, and sitting on a nearby curb. Sanchez acted in violation of F.S.S. 843.02.

My BWC was activated during this incident and the case is cleared by arrest.

On 06/02/2019 at approximately 2230 hours, I (Ofc. A. Litton) went to the 300 block of Southard Street to assist Sergeant M. Siracuse with a suspicious vehicle.

When I arrived, I recognized the subject, Juan Sanchez from a previous encounter at 3032 N Roosevelt Blvd where Sanchez was issued a warning for lodging in his vehicle. I saw Sanchez's vehicle still had items inside including clothes, food, toiletries, towels, blankets, a dog, etc. that indicated he was living out of his car. Sanchez even said he was living in his vehicle.

The vehicle was clearly parked along a yellow curb directly in front of a "No Parking" sign. Sanchez was very combative as Sgt. M. Siracuse tried to explain his reasoning for the encounter. Sanchez was given numerous lawful commands including identifying himself with a driver's license, opening the window to speak with an officer and opening his door. Sanchez did not comply with any of these commands and was argumentative.

When Sanchez finally exited the vehicle, Sgt. M. Siracuse asked him to sit on the curb behind the vehicle. Sanchez, again, was argumentative and did not comply with the orders given. Sanchez was asked one more time to sit on the curb before Sgt. M. Siracuse deployed OC spray, which hit Sanchez in the face and made him drop to his knees. Sanchez was told to place his hands behind his back, which he did, to allow me to handcuff him.

Sanchez was treated by Key West Rescue 2 for the OC spray, and transported to Lower Keys Medical Center for medical clearance. I rode in the ambulance to Lower Keys Medical Center to assist the EMS with Sanchez. At the hospital, Sanchez was given the opportunity to wash off the OC spray, was medically cleared and transported to MCDC by Ofc. K. Waite and myself without incident.

Axon BWC was activated during this encounter.

On June 3, 2019 I, Ofc. Waite, responded as backup to the 300 Block of Southard Street for Sgt. Siracuse who was out with a suspicious vehicle. On arrival, I approached the vehicle and immediately recognized the driver, Juan Sanchez-Alonzo, from a friendly encounter that I had with him recently. Sanchez-Alonzo appeared extremely agitated. Sanchez-Alonzo was continuously yelling and interrupting Sgt. Siracuse.

Due to my previous encounter with Sanchez-Alonzo, I believed that I had a good rapport with him. I approached the driver's side of his vehicle and asked him to speak with me. Sanchez-Alonzo recognized me, and appeared to calm down a bit, however he was still extremely agitated and stated that he had not committed a crime. I informed Sanchez-Alonzo that he was parked in a designated no parking zone and asked him to step out the vehicle. Sanchez-Alonzo asked me why he had to step out of the vehicle. I informed Sanchez-Alonzo that if he did not exit the vehicle he would be removed from the vehicle. Sanchez-Alonzo complied but told his wife, whom was on speaker phone during most of this encounter, that he was being forced to exit the vehicle and gave her his location.

Once out of the car, Sgt. Siracuse directed Sanchez-Alonzo to sit on the curb behind his vehicle. Sanchez-Alonzo refused. Sgt. Siracuse asked Sanchez-Alonzo again to sit on the curb. Sanchez-Alonzo refused again and began to yell at Sgt. Siracuse. Sgt. Siracuse deployed his OC spray on Sanchez-Alonzo. Sanchez-Alonzo immediately dropped to the ground and was subsequently placed into handcuffs by Ofc. Litton. KWFD Rescue was requested to decontaminate Sanchez-Alonzo. Sgt. Siracuse and Ofc. Litton watched over Sanchez-Alonzo until rescue arrived.

While awaiting Rescue, I observed a white female approaching the scene. The female, later identified as Teresa Blanco, advised me that Sanchez-Alonzo was her husband. Blanco had her cell phone out and appeared to be video recording our interaction. Sanchez-Alonzo asked to speak with a supervisor, and I informed Sgt. Rodriguez. Sgt. Rodriguez arrived and spoke with Blanco.

Ofc. Litton accompanied Rescue as they transported Sanchez-Alonzo to Lower Keys Medial Center. I followed Rescue to the hospital. Once treated, Ofc. Litton and I transported Sanchez-Alonzo to the Monroe County Detention Center without incident.

My BWC was activated throughout this call.
