AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, AMENDING CHAPTER 70 OF THE FLORIDA, CODE OF ORDINANCES ENTITLED "TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES" BY AMENDING ARTICLE IV -STOPPING AND STANDING", "EMPLOYEE **PARKING** DIVISION 7, PERMIT PROGRAM IN HISTORIC DISTRICT", AMENDING SECTION 70-261 TO ADJUST THE DESIGNATED LOTS FOR THIS PERMIT PROGRAM BY ADDING THE JACKSON SQUARE PARKING LOT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City of Key West intends to install parking meters at Jackson Square parking lot, and finds that there exists excess parking capacity that would be of use to local workers that hold an "Employee Parking Lot Permit."

WHEREAS, the City of Key West finds that parking in the Historic District is a hardship for many employees of businesses in the upper and middle Duval Commercial Core.

WHEREAS, designating the Jackson Square Parking Lot for the Employee Parking Lot Permit Program will promote the welfare of the working citizens of the City of Key West.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That Section 70-261 of the Code of
Ordinances is hereby amended as follows*:

<u>Sec. 70-261</u>. - Description; Proof of eligibility and application; display of permit.

The Employee Parking Lot Permit allows employees of businesses in the Historic District to park during their scheduled work hours in designated municipal lot(s) determined to have excess parking capacity. The City Manager is authorized to designate lot(s) for this permit program. Currently the Old Town Garage (Park and Ride) lot, and Truman Waterfront Park Parking lots and Jackson Square Parking Lot are designated.

Section 2: If any section, provision, clause, phrase, or application of this Ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional for any reason by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable therefrom and shall be construed as reasonable and necessary to achieve the lawful purposes of this Ordinance.

Section 3: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances of said City in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby superseded to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4: This Ordinance shall go into effect
immediately upon its passage and adoption and
authentication by the signature of the presiding officer
and the Clerk of the Commission.
