Existing Regulations insufficient to ensure retailer compliance with current restrictions and do not include Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems (ENDS)







Tobacco Retail Licensing (TRL)

A Policy Tool

- Can require all businesses obtain/maintain a license from the city or county government
- Ability to implement and enforce a variety of restrictions to reduce access and exposure to tobacco products
- Address youth vaping epidemic
- Addressing health inequities is a promising potential use of TRLs
- Annual fees produce sustainable programs that permit regular enforcement





Success Stories

Alachua County, FL

- License required for tobacco and ENDS-only retailers
- Restriction of tobacco sales to retailers more than 1,000 ft. away from district schools
- Requirement for vape shops to obtain the local TRL
- Increase in local minimum legal sales age to 21
