

On October 15, 2019 at 0232 hrs. I (Officer Tyler) was dispatched to Flagler and 1st Street in reference to a traffic stop Officer Purcell had initiated.

Upon arrival, I observed a Silver in color Nissan car bearing Florida license plate # DV413614. Sitting on the curb behind the Nissan was the driver Justin Glenn Todaro, identified by his Florida Identification Card Number T360-427-80-288-0.

I spoke with Officer Purcell who stated the following.

Officer Purcell, observed a Silver Nissan driving outbound on Flagler Ave. The Nissan was swerving but staying in its lane. He pulled closer to the Nissan in order to read the Florida license plate (DV4136H). The Nissan pulled off on the right side of the road and the driver stuck his arm out of the window gesturing for Officer Purcell to pass him. Officer Purcell stopped his patrol vehicle behind the Nissan. The Nissan pulled back onto the road aggressively. The Nissan then veered off the right-hand side of the road striking the curb. Officer Purcell activated his emergency lights and sirens, initiating a traffic stop. The Nissan promptly stopped on the west side of the intersection of Flagler Ave and 1st St. Officer Purcell exited his patrol vehicle and began to approach the driver side of the vehicle. The Nissan began to pull forward as he reached the rear bumper. Officer Purcell ran forward slapping the side of the Nissan giving loud verbal commands to stop the vehicle. The Nissan stopped, and he instructed the driver to put the car in park and exit the vehicle. Officer Purcell opened the driver side door of the Nissan and escorted the driver (later identified as Justin Todaro) to the curb where he instructed him to sit down. Officer Purcell asked Todaro for his driver's license. Todaro stated he did not have a driver's license due to it being suspended from a DUI.

While Speaking with Todaro he informed me he was slightly intoxicated, and his license was suspended for DUI. I could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his breath, he had red glassy eyes, very slurred speech and he could not maintain balance.

Todaro said he drank a couple beers a little bit ago. I then asked Todaro if he would submit to field sobriety exercises to dispel my belief that his mental and physical faculties were impaired to the point, he should not have been operating a motor vehicle. Todaro said he would do the exercises.

Before conducting any exercises, I asked Todaro if he had any injuries to his feet, legs, arms and body Todaro said no. I asked Todaro if he had anything wrong with his eyes such as false eyes or glaucoma. Todaro again said no. I finally asked Todaro if he had diabetes and he responded no.

The first field sobriety exercise I started with was Horizontal Gaze and Nystagmus. Todaro had equal tracking, I observed six clues from the HGN exercise. There was lack of smooth pursuit in the left and right eye, distinct and sustained Nystagmus at maximum deviation in the left and right eye. I observed the onset of Nystagmus prior to a 45-degree angle in the left and right eye. I used my pen tip as the stimulus. During HGN Todaro continually fell into me and could not keep his balance.

The second exercise I conducted was the walk and turn. I removed my instruction card from my pocket for this exercise. I had Todaro stand in the proper starting position and explained the exercise to him from the card. I demonstrated every step of the exercise and verified Todaro understood how to complete the exercise. Todaro could not maintain his balance during the instruction phase and started to soon. The area I performed my walk and turn demonstration and exercise was checked for debris and that the road was level and smooth. I verified Todaro

understood the instructions again and he stated yes, he understood. I had Todaro begin the exercise. Todaro was wearing tennis shoes. On the first nine steps, Todaro missed heel to toe on all steps. Todaro walked 6 steps on the first nine steps. Todaro could not complete the exercise. Todaro missed heel to toe on every step, stepped off the line, did not count, could not maintain balance and did not look at his feet.

The third exercise I conducted was the one leg stand. Again, I explained the directions reading from my card I had in my hand, and I demonstrated the exercise. Todaro said he understood the instructions verbally. I had Todaro begin the exercise and timed it. I timed the one leg stand for 30 seconds using my wristwatch, Todaro used his left leg for the exercise. Todaro swayed while balancing and used his arms for balance. Todaro lost balance numerous times. Todaro did not look at his foot and fell over. Todaro did not count and fell over. He used his arms for balance and could not complete the exercise.

Based on Todaro's performance on his field sobriety exercises it was my opinion that his mental and physical faculties were impaired. I placed Todaro under arrest for driving while impaired at 0252 hours.

I asked Todaro if he would submit to a breath test at the detention center. Todaro said he would take the breath test.

Officer Purcell took Todaro to the rear of my patrol car to attempt to search him incident to arrest. When Officer Purcell tried to lean Todaro on the back of my car he became violent and started fighting Officer Purcell. Officer Purcell stated the following. He escorted Todaro to my patrol car and instructed him to turn and lean against the vehicle. Todaro began to tense his body to keep from leaning on the vehicle. Officer Purcell instructed Todaro not to resist and to lean against the vehicle. Todaro began to pull away from him. Todaro then kicked Officer Purcell's leg. Officer Purcell then pulled him to the ground. Todaro's face struck the ground and he appeared to lose consciousness. Sgt Vazquez and Officer Purcell turned Todaro on to his side and called for KWFD Rescue. KWFD Rescue arrived on scene and Todaro began to regain consciousness.

When EMS was attending to Todaro he became violent again kicking his feet and fighting. Sgt. Vazquez grabbed a hobble out of his car and while attempting to hobble him Todaro moved his right leg back and kicked me in my arm. Sgt. Vazquez and I finally got Todaro hobbled but he continually fought and even tried to spit blood on Sgt. Vazquez.

Inside the ambulance Todaro continued to be violent up to the point EMS injected him with drugs to put him asleep. Once Todaro arrived at the Emergency Room and was treated he woke up and started yelling, cussing and screaming. I explained to Todaro his charges numerous times, but he continually asked why he was under arrest and cuffed to the bed.

After we arrived at the Monroe County Detention Center and were walking Todaro inside he stopped at the door leading to the elevator and would not go inside the building and pushed against Officer Purcell. Officer Purcell finally got him into the door but Todaro would not go into the elevator and we had to force him into the elevator. Inside the Elevator Todaro continually resisted and pushed back into us. Officer Purcell and I were forced to push him into the corner of the elevator to keep him from fighting us. Todaro continually pushed and pulled even while being restrained against the side of the elevator. Inside the intake room Todaro continued resisting us and we had to force him down onto the bench in the intake room.

Based on the fact Todaro was unconscious at the Hospital and I could not get a breath sample from him, I charged

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Todaro with F.S. 316.193 DUI ALCOHOL OR DRUGS based on his driving pattern and the Field Sobriety Exercises. I also charged Todaro with F.S. 322.34-2C DRIVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED 3RD OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE based on the fact his driver's license was suspended for prior DUI's. Todaro was issued his copies of his citations but was incapable of signing them due to his violent nature and could not be uncuffed.

I also charged Todaro with two counts of F.S. 784.07-2B BATTERY ON LEO for kicking me and striking Officer Purcell. Todaro was also charged with two counts of F.S. 843.01 RESIST OFFICER WITH VIOLENCE for fighting and not getting into the police vehicle and for refusing to go into the elevator, pulling away and pushing against Officer Purcell and myself.

While the Detention Deputies were processing Todaro he became violent with them and they had to restrain him and place him into the restraint chair.

The investigation was recorded on BWC.

The Nissan pulled off on the right side of the road and stuck his arm out of the window gesturing for me to pass him. I stopped my patrol vehicle behind the Nissan. The Nissan pulled back onto the road aggressively. The Nissan then veered off the right-hand side of the road striking the curb. I activated my emergency lights and sirens, initiating a traffic stop, for failure to maintain lane. I escorted Todaro to Officer Tyler's patrol car and instructed him to turn and lean against the vehicle. Todaro was becoming agitated stating he did not want to go to jail and just wanted to go home. I started to search Todaro's pockets when he began to tense his body and push away from the vehicle. I gave Todaro loud verbal commands not to resist and to lean against the vehicle. Todaro began to pull away from me struggling to get free. Todaro then kicked my leg, in an apparent attempt to flee. I placed my leg in front of his body and pulled him across my body to the ground, using a hip toss technique. Todaro's face struck the ground and he appeared to lose consciousness. Sgt Vazquez and I turned Todaro on his right side and called for KWFD Rescue. KWFD Rescue arrived on scene and Todaro began to regain consciousness. Todaro was fully alert and aware of surroundings. Todaro became agitated and Sgt. Vazquez got a hobble out of his patrol vehicle. Todaro started to kick at Officer Tyler and Sgt Vazquez as they attempted to place the hobble on his legs. One of Todaro's kicks connected with Officer Tyler. I restrained Todaro's legs while Sgt Vazquez and Officer Tyler placed the hobble on him.

KWFD Rescue transported Todaro to the Lower Keys Medical Center for further evaluation. Officer Tyler and I accompanied Todaro to the hospital in the ambulance.

Todaro was cleared from the Lower Keys Medical Center and I began to escort him to my patrol vehicle. After exiting the hospital Todaro complained one of the cuffs was hurting his wrist. I turned Todaro to face the wall and began to

remove the cuff he was complaining about to adjust it. Todaro began to tense his body and yell loudly. I re-secured the cuff until Todaro was calm enough for me to adjust it. Todaro continued to stop and act reluctant to walk to my patrol vehicle. Officer Tyler pulled my patrol car to the front of the hospital in order to shorten the distance I needed to escort Todaro to my vehicle. I placed Todaro in the back of the patrol vehicle and attempted to put his seatbelt on. Todaro slid his body away on the seat and pushed his hips out to stop me from securing his seat belt. I pushed Todaro down onto the seat and was able to get his seat belt on. I transported Todaro to the Monroe County Detention Center.

After arriving at the detention center Officer Tyler and I removed Todaro from the patrol vehicle and began to escort him towards the elevator to intake. Todaro became agitated and refused to enter the elevator. Officer Tyler and I forced Todaro into the elevator. Todaro continued to yell and push back into us. Officer Tyler and I held Todaro in the corner of the elevator to stop him from potentially causing injury to one of us. Once in intake correction officers assisted Officer Tyler and myself in moving Todaro to the bench.

Corrections officers removed Todaro's handcuffs. Shortly after removing the handcuffs Todaro became aggressive and corrections officers took him to the ground. I assisted the corrections officers in placing handcuffs back on Todaro. Todaro was then placed in a restraint chair.

This investigation was recorded with my Axon BWC.

On 10/15/2019 at about 0232 hours, Ofc. Purcell conducted a traffic stop at 1812 Flagler Ave, for failure to maintain. I responded as back up.

The stop subsequently turned into a DUI investigation. The arrestee: Justin Todaro DOB 08/08/1980, was placed in handcuffs by DUI Ofc. Tyler. Ofc. Purcell walked Todaro to the rear of Ofc. Tyler's patrol car. Once at the rear of the patrol car, Todaro began to tense his body and became agitated that he was going to jail. Ofc. Purcell gave loud verbal commands for Todaro to stop and stay against the car while he conducted a search of his person. Todaro suddenly and swiftly, kicked Ofc. Purcell's leg in an apparent attempt to flee. Ofc. Purcell placed his leg in front of Todaro, and pulled him across his body to the ground, using a hip toss technique. Todaro's face struck the ground and he appeared to lose consciousness.

I immediately called for rescue. Todaro was also bleeding from the face, and nose area. Todaro gain consciousness a few minutes later. Once rescue responded, Todaro became belligerent again and had to be physically restrained using a Hobble restraint. Once in the ambulance, Todaro was sedated and transported to the hospital.

I completed a RRI report.

I had no further involvemnet in this case.
