A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-771(c) OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES THE DISPOSAL OF TWO (2) SURPLUS AND OBSOLETE CITY BUSES; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE ANY NECESSARY DOCUMENTS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, two City-owned buses, originally acquired for more than \$50,000.00, are surplus and obsolete, and City staff recommends disposal by donation to organizations/programs that will benefit from their use; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation has provided documentation to KWDOT, granting the approval and release of Lien/Certificate of Titles for these buses, and authorized the City KWDoT to "utilize as you wish;" and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the disposal of two (2) obsolete City buses, as described in the attached memorandum from Rod Delostrinos, Director, Key West Department of Transportation, dated January 27, 2020 is authorized as follows: Bus #803, also known as City Vehicle Asset #10113, will be repurposed for fire safety emergency training by the Key West Fire Department; Bus 809, also known as City Vehicle Asset #30304, will be donated to the College of the Florida Keys for use by a planned CDL Driver Training/Testing program.

Section 2: That the City Manager, upon advice and consent of
the City Attorney, is authorized to execute all necessary documents.
Section 3: That this Resolution shall go into effect immediately

the Presiding Officer and the Clerk of the Commission.
