Kinne Associates, LLC (KA) is pleased to respond to the Request for Proposals (RFP) NO. 002-20 *Emergency Management Consulting Services* for the City of Key West (City). KA is a small business consulting organization based in Hollywood, Florida, and we specialize in crisis and disaster management. The KA Team has worked on numerous disasters in Florida and the Florida Keys, including Hurricane Hermine, Hurricane Matthew, the multiple hurricanes of 2004/2005, and a major flooding event in 2014. Our core management team has an average of 30 years' experience in disaster response and recovery with established expertise in FEMA grant programs and insurance claims. We provide efficient emergency management services, including preparedness, training, mitigation, and recovery to all levels of governments.

Established in 2010, KA has a full-time staff of 47 employees and a cadre of over 250 temporary employees that include nationally recognized FEMA Public Assistance (PA) program experts, debris management experts, hazard mitigation specialists, professional engineers, project managers, insurance specialists, Environmental and Historic Preservations (EHP) specialists, Certified Floodplain Managers, Individual Assistance Specialists, certified trainers, and emergency responders. We can help the City develop and implement strategies designed to maximize federal and state assistance; provide expert programmatic and policy advice on federal disaster relief programs; provide financial grant management support; and, assist with emergency preparedness by conducting specialized training and exercise support and reviewing and testing of emergency management plans and procedures.

We have extensive experience assisting our clients with Initial Damage Assessments (IDA), Joint Preliminary Damage Assessments (PDA), site inspections and development and formulation of FEMA Project Worksheets (PWs), eligibility/compliance reviews, scope of work/project cost changes, requests for time extensions, and final program review and project closeout. We can also train and mentor City staff on FEMA's processes to enhance your ability to handle future disaster events and can provide project management services, assist with emergency planning and help ensure effective fiscal oversight. When necessary, we have the knowledge and experience to successfully pursue additional Federal funding through appeals and arbitration.

The KA Team includes instructors and trainers that have the necessary experience and credentials to satisfy the Training and Emergency Preparedness requirements listed in the Scope of Services of the RFP. We can provide comprehensive training to City staff regarding the Incident Command System (ICS), Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP) development, and can also facilitate exercises and drills to test readiness capabilities of emergency response plans and ICS concepts. We have utilized ICS concepts in response and



recovery operations, and served as Incident Commander, Planning Section Chief, Operations Sections Chief, and Logistics Section Chief on local and State Incident Management Teams. We have participated in joint National Level Exercises with Federal, state and local officials to test readiness capabilities of emergency response plans; and, have provided professional training related to the development of emergency management plans and procedures on the Federal, state and local level.

We have extensive experience analyzing disaster events from the initial phase of response operations to determine the amount of potential eligible federal funding; assessing impacts on critical infrastructure; identifying life, health, and safety concerns; identifying immediate needs of the impacted communities; evaluating situational requirements; implementing response activities and recovery programs; determining operational requirements; estimating and projecting program expenditures; establishing operations plans; developing strategic timelines and program goals; establishing and implementing tracking systems and monitoring plans; and, identifying and addressing training requirements.

Our Team members are fully knowledgeable of FEMA's documentation requirements and capable of managing the information to ensure payment by FEMA. The KA Team has been instrumental in development of the FEMA's new PA Delivery Model and Grants Management system which is now required for all disaster operations. 

Qualifications

The Kinne Associates resources that will be assigned to the City for this project will vary slightly based on the specific disaster event. However, 90% of our representatives have a minimum of over 10 years' experience working with FEMA's PA program. While working directly for FEMA, our team members gained extensive disaster field experience managing and administering all aspects of the PA Program while mentoring and training FEMA, State, and Technical Assistance Contractors on eligibility issues and PA program delivery. Over the years, we have assisted hundreds of municipalities through every step of the FEMA recovery process including:

- Maximize federal funding;
- Identify and develop scope of work for Section 428 projects;
- Compliance with all federal paperwork requirements;
- Supplement existing accounting and documentation systems to ease the burden of complying with FEMA/State processes and requirements;
- Site inspection and order of magnitude cost of repair;
- Determine and maximize hazard mitigation opportunities;
- Determination of eligibility and categorization of projects;
- Facilitate temporary facilities funding as needed;
- Reconcile FEMA and insurance recoveries;
- Advise on a financial recovery strategy that addresses immediate and long-term recovery;



- Training to build and enhance internal capacity for future disaster events;
- Respond to Office of Inspector General Audits;
- Advise on appeals or arbitration, if necessary; and,

Past projects include major disaster (hurricane, flooding) events approaching the billion-dollar mark for large municipalities. Services comprised of initial response efforts in public assistance, to management of PA grants, to successful appeal and arbitration submissions. Additional projects include mock training exercises, preparedness planning, and outreach programs between public entities and local businesses.

The KA Team has been involved with very complex, large-dollar projects, and have helped secure substantial funding for our clients, including developing and processing over 1,000 PWs for the City of Nashville, Tennessee, with approximately \$1 billion dollars for the repairs to infrastructure, all processed and obligated within 15 months from the date of declaration. In the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, we worked with Senator Mary Landrieu to pass special legislation and reach an unprecedented settlement with FEMA, resulting in \$1.8 billion to fund a more comprehensive construction plan for the Louisiana Recovery School District (RSD) and the Orleans Parish School Board (OPSB), which involved 127 severely damaged school campuses, affecting education of over 50,000 K-12 students.

Between September 2014 through February 2015, we provided PA Program Operations Support directly to FEMA following a major event in the Florida panhandle in April of 2014. Although initially deployed to train and mentor FEMA Task Force Leads in the field, our Team was requested to relocate to the satellite office in Escambia City and co-located with the FEMA Public Assistance Officer to provide guidance and support for the management and implementation of all aspects of the PA program for that event.

The KA Team is currently assisting the County of Los Angeles, California, with numerous legacy disasters. Our efforts include Final Inspection and Closeout of Large Projects across all categories of work and involves many complex and somewhat contentious projects. Los Angeles County government includes over 35 separate departments and layers of entities within the departments. The KA Team manages the County's conflicting priorities and we have established protocols to address the various disasters in a timely manner. Grant administration activities performed for the County include managing grant funding received while adhering to regulatory requirements for project performance and timelines.



The KA Team in Los Angeles also manages the Federal and State requirements for uncompleted work by requesting time extensions for the Period of Performance and the Administrative requirements for appeals; DHS OIG Audits; and, if applicable, Arbitration. In addition to the Federal Closeout activities for LA County, KA is also managing funding received from the State of California through the California Disaster Assistance Act (CDAA) for disaster events without a Federal Declaration. We are also assisting the County with HUD's Community Development Block Grants (CDBG).

The KA Team has also recently begun working for the Town of Yankeetown, located in Levy County, Florida. Our Team is in place to assist the Town with debris monitoring, preparing FEMA PWs and detailed damage inspection reports, preparing Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) applications, project management, conducting federal and State of Florida agency consultations, and grant closeout.

Management Team Qualifications

Our designated Contract Manager for this RFP is Richard Kinne, who is the former Director of Response and Recovery for Witt Associates, and brings the highly coveted blend of disaster management and a specialty in large-scale insurance adjustments of catastrophic disaster events. Mark Beto is our designated Project Manager for this RFP, and he is a nationally recognized PA program expert with over 20 years' experience in disaster response and recovery operations with FEMA – including Hurricane Isabel in Virginia, numerous severe flooding events throughout the country, and catastrophic hurricanes, such as Katrina, Rita, Gustav in Louisiana.

To address the Training and Emergency Preparedness requirements in the Scope of Services of this RFP, the KA Team includes Lead Instructor and Exercise Program Leader Steve Gluck, who is the Emergency Manager for the U.S. Army at Fort Sill, Oklahoma. He is an authorized NIMS/ICS instructor for the Army as well as through the State of Oklahoma. He meets all instructor requirements and has been re-certified on the new ICS curriculum. He has been involved in disaster exercises for nearly 38 years, having been in every position from a player to the Exercise Director.

For Training and Emergency Preparedness, the KA Team also includes Assistant Chief Dennis Beyer (ret.), who after 9/11 became the first Homeland Security Director for the City of Tulsa and served as chairman of the Tulsa Homeland Security Task Force. As Homeland Security Director, Chief Beyer led the effort to develop, administer, and maintain the Tulsa Area National Incident Management System (NIMS) Implementation Plan, which included the development of the Oklahoma Incident Management Team (OK-IMT). Chief Beyer currently works with the private and public sectors as a consultant and continues to instruct NIMS All Hazards IMT courses across the country. In addition, he deploys to major incidents including Hurricanes Harvey, Irma, and Michael. He is credentialed as a Type 3 Incident Commander and Advanced NIMS-ICS instructor.

For the Emergency Response Scope of Services in this RFP, one of the PA Subject Matter Experts (SME) available for this project is Richard Cruse, who has 25 years Emergency Management experience with 20 years working for FEMA as a Public Assistance Officer, Infrastructure Branch



Director, Deputy Federal Coordinating Officer, and Deputy Director of Long-Term Recovery. Another PA SME for this project is Robert Talley, who has worked in the FEMA PA program for 15 years. He has been deployed on over 60 disasters with positions that included Task Force Lead, Public Assistance Coordinator, Project Specialist, PA Closeout Specialist, QA/QC Specialist, Debris Specialist, and Insurance Specialist.

Other KA Team members that will augment and support the project as needed include Raymond Lenaburg, who has more than 45 years of experience in floodplain management, water resources, hydraulic modeling, dam safety, mitigation planning, and floodplain analysis, with 37 of those years working for FEMA Region 9 as the Risk Analysis Branch Chief in the Mitigation Division. For any audits or appeals, and to help ensure the City's documentation is in order, Chris Bomhoff will also support the team. Chris has more than 7 years' experience in crisis and emergency management with a focus in arbitration as an Arbitration and Audit Specialist in the FEMA Public Assistance program. His experience includes analyzing audit recommendations, formulating and completing a corrective action plan, and drafting responses to the Office of Inspector General.

To provide technical support to the Team, we have Christopher Ritter, PE, who has 29 years of office and field experience in the construction management industry as a Project Manager. Chris began working as a FEMA Technical Assistance Contractor (TAC) in 2011 and has assisted in the project formulation of numerous high profile and contentious projects in Louisiana from Hurricane Katrina and in New York for Hurricane Sandy in 2012.

The KA Team includes database developers and Microsoft Access experts who have experience establishing protocols for all PA project reporting requirements. KA professionals also include experts in FEMA's Individual Assistance Programs who have worked directly with states and individuals to assess damages to residential structures; housing assistance needs; Other Needs Assistance (ONA); coordination with Voluntary Agencies (VOLAG); and, other disaster programs administered by other Federal Agencies (OFAs), including USDA and USDHHS. We also have experienced trainers and exercise facilitators who will support this project as needed.

SCOPE OF SERVICES – Emergency Response

Recognizing the Scope of Services in the RFP includes supporting ongoing recovery efforts associated with Hurricane Irma, which was declared a major disaster in September of 2017, as well as supporting response and recovery operations for any future storms during the contract term, we offer a full-range of services that are designed to help the City efficiently and effectively address any PA program requirement. Upon Notice to Proceed, Kinne Associates will immediately deploy the Management Team, as discussed above, to coordinate with the City to identify priorities and develop strategies for addressing the overall situation. The initial deployment of the Management Team is intended to help establish the workload priorities, and the Team would be expanded/contracted as needed.

For Hurricane Irma, our suggested approach would be to work with the City to identify any areas of concern related to grants management responsibilities, including a review of financial systems to help ensure documentation is sufficient to support FEMA reimbursements. We will review the status of all open PW grant awards to ensure that regulatory timelines for



completing the disaster work are being met. And, if needed, we will assist the City in submitting Time Extension requests to the State. We will use our advanced knowledge and experience with FEMA's PA program to ensure that all permanent work projects are fully considered for 406 Hazard Mitigation and that all disaster damage was properly identified and accounted for on PWs with a complete and accurate scope of work and cost estimate. We will help ensure the City is set up for successful closeout of all PW grant awards. And, if necessary, we can assist with any administrative requirements for appeals, DHS OIG Audits, and Arbitration. We will also assist in managing any funds received through HUD's Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) or the Federal Highway Administration.

For Hurricane Irma and any future disaster event, our approach would be to use our Team Leads to divide the overall workload and requirements into two general areas of responsibility, with one team concentrating on field activities associated damage assessment, meeting with FEMA for site inspections, and development of PWs. The other team would be responsible for support activities, such as 406 and 404 Hazard Mitigation Programs, Environmental and Historic Preservation, insurance, engineering/cost estimating, appeals and arbitration, and resource coordination and reports.

The Team Leads would develop a priority listing of projects and establish critical paths and Gantt Charts to address every project. The Gannt Charts would establish the overall schedule to address the workload for each team and would identify projects that require technical assistance. The Gannt Chart would establish the sequencing of the technical reviews and be used by the Team Leads and Project Manager to schedule the technical support, as needed. In most cases, the Technical Specialists from the KA Team would provide support remotely and not need to deploy to the City. The Technical Specialists would be on-call to provide support, as needed, and be utilized in a strategic manner to reduce costs and maintain schedules.

<u>Reports</u>: Kinne Associates has managed multi-faceted statewide projects and has tracking systems to provide details of staff resources, activities and accomplishments. We will submit reports to ensure the City remains fully informed of our activities and progress and is aware of any issues or impediments. The Gantt Charts developed by the Team Leads that will be used to establish the overall sequencing of our activities will also serve to provide clarity on City documents and duties, as compared to KA work products and duties, and will include reference to timelines, deadlines, and resource planning.

<u>Scope of Services Provided</u>: We present the following detailed approach to address the Scope of Services in the RFP, which is applicable for the current Hurricane Irma work, as well as any future disaster event. Based on our expertise in the PA program, KA can ensure all program requirements are satisfied and help the City maximize available assistance.

<u>Damage Assessment</u>: Immediately following an event, Kinne Associates can assist the City, starting with the Initial Damage Assessments (IDA) and Joint Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA). We will prepare a master list of damaged sites as identified by the various entities within the City, assign SMEs that will work with the City to validate the sites, train City entities on the process of Damage Assessments and in the format required by the State and FEMA. The documentation developed through the damage assessment process is the crucial building block



that leads into a request for major disaster, and, ultimately, into the development of PWs for FEMA grant assistance.

Applicants Brief: Once the City receives a major disaster declaration, Kinne Associates can coordinate with the City entities to ensure complete participation in the Public Assistance Applicant's Briefing, which is when the City officially submits a Request for Public Assistance (RPA) and begins the process of working with FEMA and the State to schedule follow-up meetings and site inspections. Based on the damage assessment process, we will develop an inventory of damaged sites and projects, including mapping damaged sites by GPS Coordinates, and develop a digital central depository for the data. Additionally, we will identify Special Considerations within the inventory, including Insurance issues, environmental and historic concerns, Flood Insurance Rate Map data (FIRMS or DFIRMS), and 406 Hazard Mitigation opportunities.

Kinne Associates will also pursue assistance from other Federal and/or State Agencies, including NRCS, HUD, FHWA, and USDA. These Federal entities, at times, work through State or local agencies. However, all require a formal request for assistance. Within seven days of a declared event, Kinne Associates will contact each entity if the type of event coincides with the available Federal or State assistance.

Recovery Scoping Meeting ("Kick-off Meeting"): Following the Applicant's Briefing, we will assist the City with the Recovery Scoping Meeting, which is considered the first substantive meeting that FEMA/State schedules with a Subrecipient. Our information developed during the IDA and PDA process will be used to create the Damage Inventory, which is the critical driver in FEMA's New Delivery Model. The Damage Inventory will be presented to FEMA during the Scoping Meeting to identify damage sites, establish City recovery priorities, identify potential 406 Hazard Mitigation opportunities, and establish potential Environmental and Historic Preservation assistance needs.

Site Inspections/Project Description/Scope Development: On behalf of the City, we will schedule site inspections with the State and FEMA to identify damages and document costs associated with emergency response activities, debris removal operations, and all permanent work categories. For more complex projects, our Technical Experts will fully develop the Damage Description & Dimensions (DDD), the Scope of Work (SOW), and the estimated costs to repair the disaster damaged facilities. Our SMEs have been involved with numerous high-profile, and, at times, contentious projects, and have the expertise to develop detailed damage descriptions and dimensions. We address every project with the five key questions: "what, when, where, how, and how much". This is normally all that is needed to create a detailed description of damages and the damage dimensions and the genesis of a complete and thorough scope of work. We will work with the City, State, and FEMA to ensure all items of work are captured and will ensure that the scopes of work include current International Building Codes or City adopted codes and standards.

<u>Project Cost Estimation & Documentation</u>: FEMA may accept an estimate from the City when the estimate is properly documented. Kinne Associates SMEs will assist in the cost estimates, identifying to FEMA and the State the City's historic costs for most items of work. Our Specialists include Cost Estimating Format (CEF) veterans who will validate and verify FEMA's



estimate for accuracy, appropriate unit costs and quantities, and fair CEF Factors. This is critical if the City considers a project a candidate for Section 428 Alternative Procedures Projects.

<u>Preparing Small Project Worksheets</u>: A project eligible under Section 422 Simplified Procedures of the Stafford Act, with a total cost of less than \$131,100 (Fiscal Year 2020 - this threshold changes every fiscal year) is considered by FEMA to be a "Small Project". Our PA program experts will develop cost estimates for all small projects where the work has not been completed and will ensure complete and accurate documentation is assembled to provide FEMA answers to category-specific Essential Elements of Information. We will also work with the State and FEMA to expedite immediate closeout of the small projects once they are obligated by FEMA to help ease the administrative burden of tracking and managing open projects.

Preparing Large Project Worksheets: For projects with a total cost of more than \$131,100 (Fiscal Year 2020 - this threshold changes every fiscal year), FEMA considers these PWs to be "Large Projects." It is essential to consider the grouping of individual sites when developing PWs. We can help ensure that the grouping of sites is based on the City's priorities, and not on FEMA's desire to group many sites onto one Large Project PW. Our PA experts will ensure that all damages are captured, either as individual sites or in logical groupings, to create large projects. Kinne Associates strategic planning includes early identification of projects/sites that may delay the review and subsequent funding of a project. We will work with the City to identify mitigation opportunities for repair or replacement projects and ensure that the additional mitigation work is included in the PWs.

Improved Project: When conducting repair or replacement projects, the City may wish to make improvements to a damaged facility that are not required by eligible codes or standards. For these projects we can assist the City in obtaining required approval from the State. And, if the Improved Project significantly changes the pre-disaster configuration of the facility, we can help ensure the project request is forwarded to FEMA so that appropriate EHP laws, regulations, and Executive Orders are reviewed for necessary compliance. Our program experts can develop an accurate and complete cost estimate to ensure that all applicable costs are captured.

<u>Alternate Project</u>: Alternate Projects allow the City to forgo repairing a damaged facility and to use the otherwise eligible funding from FEMA towards an alternate project. For these types of projects, it is essential to develop an accurate and complete cost estimate based on the work that is necessary to restore the original facility, and it is critical to obtain FEMA's approval prior to initiating work. Under the Disaster Recovery Reform Act of 2018, the reduction of assistance for alternate projects has been eliminated; so, this funding option is now more advantageous. And Kinne Associates can work with the City to explore this option.

Alternative Procedures Project (Large Projects only): Section 428 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, as amended, (Stafford Act) authorizes FEMA to award PA funding based on fixed estimates. Known as 428 Alternative Procedures, this Pilot Program includes the authority to consolidate multiple permanent work projects to offer the maximum amount of flexibility; and, if there is a cost underrun, the excess funds kept and used for a variety of different projects. The incentive to the City is the possibility of using a fixed budget to manage multiple projects, without the requirement to build back as before the



disaster, and no requirement to track costs to specific work items or facilities. Kinne Associates can provide guidance on how to best utilize this approach with the intent to enable the City to drive its own recovery.

Identifying Cost-effective Mitigation Measures: Our Team includes Sections 406 and 404 Hazard Mitigation Specialists that can assist the City in maximizing resiliency and protection of damage to public and private property. We can evaluate proposed PA mitigation measures for eligibility; cost-effectiveness; technical feasibility; and, compliance with EHP laws, regulations, and Executive Orders. We can also work with the City to develop a comprehensive understanding of ongoing challenges that could be addressed by applying for Statewide Section 404 Hazard Mitigation funds. Our Mitigation Specialists are very experienced using FEMA's Benefit Costs Analysis (BCA) software and know how to maximize its methodologies. Our Mitigation Specialists will ensure the City takes full advantage of FEMA's available funding for hazard mitigation.

Identifying/Resolving Special Considerations: When conducting work with FEMA grant funds, it is critical to initiate and coordinate consultation with FEMA, State, and other Federal Agencies to ensure compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the Clean Water Act, the Clean Air Act, the Endangered Species Act, the National Historic Preservation Act, and other federal statutes and executive orders. Our program experts can help ensure that the critical coordination takes place at the earliest stage of the recovery process. And, our Team includes Certified Floodplain Managers (CFM) available to the City to assist with projects located in Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHA). We will evaluate the impacts of City actions within the SFHA to comply with Executive Orders 11988 and 11990 (Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands).

<u>Insurance</u>: If there are any issues related to insurance, the KA Team has multiple insurance experts, including Richard Kinne, who is a nationally recognized FEMA Insurance Specialist who has reviewed thousands of PWs and is intimately familiar with the insurance requirements related to the FEMA PA program. We can work directly with your insurance company to ensure you receive the maximum recovery available under the policy, and we will review all PWs to ensure that FEMA requirements to obtain and maintain insurance coverage is adequate and necessary.

Reviewing PWs: Kinne Associates has a long history of preparing damage surveys and related costs for repairs for FEMA disaster grants and are experts in obtaining and maintaining superior documentation to facilitate obligation of projects and timely closure of PW grant awards and disasters. We will work with the City to review all PWs to ensure all eligible work and costs have been fully and accurately captured. We can identify any situations where FEMA may be misapplying the PA program authorities and work to influence the process, with documented facts, when subjective determinations are not supported by Law or Regulation.

<u>Eligibility Determinations</u>: The KA Team includes appeals and arbitration experts as well as FEMA PA policy experts. Frankly, we know policy and how it is implemented better than most FEMA staff working today, and we have experience developing appeal responses and responses to OIG Audits while working with FEMA. We can assist the City with any eligibility determinations and work with FEMA, as needed, to help resolve any issues.



<u>PW Exit Briefs</u>: Kinne Associates will attend, with City representation, the FEMA-required Exit Briefings, to once again ensure all eligible work and costs have been fully documented and captured in the PWs. The Exit Briefing often is the final opportunity to communicate with the FEMA representative that serviced the City during the Recovery Operations and allows for additional documentation to be submitted by the City if a disagreement exists in any portion of the PA Program.

<u>PW Management and Close-Out</u>: Kinne Associates can assist the City in requesting and obtaining funding on obligated projects. We will submit to the State requests for progress funding disbursements for obligated projects and correlate the supporting documentation to the request for payment. We will monitor all Program compliance requirements, including requests to extend a project's Period of Performance.

<u>Preparing PW Versions for Cost Adjustments</u>: All project activities will be tracked for costs purposes, and we will perform interim inspections of sites to identify to the City any project that may exceed the approved and obligated estimate. If an eligible project overrun is identified, we will analyze the reason for the overrun, and, when appropriate, prepare an amended version of the project for State and FEMA consideration.

<u>PW/Disaster Reporting</u>: Kinne Associates experts include database developers and reports specialists with the ability to manipulate data to any requirements the City may have. Our Reports Specialists are experts in Grant Manager and EMMIE and retrieving static information,



as well as developing reports tracking progression of all project worksheet versions through closeout; identifying trends; project production; review status; obligated dollars; and, all project status, including Final Inspections and Closeouts. The data can be presented to satisfy all stakeholders and tailored to specific audiences, as directed by the City.

<u>Construction Management</u>: The KA team includes engineers and senior project managers with vast experience in the construction management industry who can develop and review technical scopes of work and cost estimates. We can help manage and monitor your construction projects; prepare weekly and monthly reports; supervise field inspectors and field activities; and, actively advise, assist, and support in formulating, delivering, and successfully implementing small to large complex infrastructure projects.

<u>Management Costs/Direct Administrative Costs (DAC)</u>: The services listed above are generally reimbursed by FEMA through its Management Costs allowance. SCOPE OF SERVICES – Emergency Preparation

<u>Training/Emergency Planning</u>: As noted above, the KA Team includes instructors and trainers that have the necessary experience and credentials to satisfy the Emergency Training and Planning requirements listed in the Scope of Services of the RFP. The KA Team's in-depth knowledge and experience will be available to provide comprehensive training to City staff regarding the Incident Command System (ICS), Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan



(CEMP) development, and can also facilitate exercises and drills to test readiness capabilities of emergency response plans and ICS concepts.

<u>Training Classes</u>: The KA Team will customize our Training courses/programs to meet the specific needs of the City. Our experienced, professional Instructors will address all the training services listed in this section of the RFP by coordinating with the City to ensure all requirements are satisfied. Specifically, the KA Team will provide copies of all materials (presentations, handouts, etc.) at least one week prior to any scheduled training for review and approval by the City. All materials will be in compliance with the most current federal and state educational requirements. We will handle all pre-event advertisements for the training, as well as all necessary registrations, set-up and tear down of the training area; and, we will provide all necessary training equipment and materials for the class, including Course Closeout Packages for each course.

The KA Team will provide training for City staff and contractors on all aspects of the National Incident Management System (NIMS), including IS-300 Intermediate ICS, IS-400 Advanced ICS, and CEMP Refresher. We will design each Training Course based on the City's CEMP, including Hazard Annexes and Department Emergency Response Plans, as well as a review of any changes to the CEMP.

Our Training Objectives and Curricula will be customized to provide individual attention to the various functions of the ICS structure, including: Incident Commander, Public Information Officer, Liaison Officer/EOC Representative, Safety Officer, Operations Section Chief, Operations Branch Director, Planning Section Chief and Support Personnel, Logistics Section Chief and Support Personnel, and, Finance and Administration Section Chief and Support Personnel. We will also provide General Safety Refresher Training.

<u>CEMP Update</u>: The KA Team will provide professional services involved with the annual review, edit, publication, release and distribution for a comprehensive update of the City's CEMP. Our services will include review and submittal of revisions of the City's CEMP to ensure accuracy and cohesiveness with current policy and practices. The KA Team will participate/facilitate coordination meetings and workshops with different groups of City employees to gather information necessary for the updates. We will also review After Action Reports from past exercises to ensure that needed corrective actions are included in the CEMP update. Release and distribution of the CEMP Update will be included as part of the CEMP Refresher Class.

Exercise and Drills: The KA Team includes authorized NIMS/ICS instructors, as well as Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP) instructors that can design, develop, facilitate, and evaluate exercises and drills. The KA Team can also handle special projects training and exercise needs as directed by the City. The KA Team's professional services includes researching grant funding available to the City to off-set the cost of the drills and exercises; and, if required, we will assist the City is applying for the grant funding and ensure compliance with the requirements of the grant funding received.

For the CEMP Exercise, we will design, develop, facilitate and evaluate an Exercise to test the City's emergency response capabilities in accordance with the CEMP and in compliance with HSEEP. Our professional services include all pre-exercise, exercise, and post-exercise logistics,



including research, planning, development, communications, facilitating, evaluating, and reporting. To prepare for the Exercise, as directed, the KA Team will participate in pre-exercise planning meetings with the City's Exercise Team to develop the exercise scenario. Following the exercise, our services will include development and publication of an After-Action report. We will provide all necessary equipment to conduct the exercise or drill, as well an exercise closeout package.

In Service Drills: The KA Team will design, develop, facilitate, and evaluate a drill to test the City's ability to properly complete the necessary ICS Forms during an event. Our services include design and presentation of scenarios that challenge attendees to decide which ICS Form is to be used and then allows the attendee to complete the required ICS Form. We will also design, develop, facilitate and evaluate an exercise to test the City's ability to establish and operate and Joint Information Center (JIC), which will include a JIC Refresher Training that involves scenarios that require the attendee to decide if a JIC is to be used and then allows attendees to establish and operate a mock JIC.

The KA professional services will include all pre-drill, drill, and post-drill logistics including research, planning, facilitation and reporting. Our reporting will include drill closeout packages with participant rosters, drill overview and results, and participant evaluation.
