I received a complaint regarding a missing Royal Poinciana tree in the courtyard at Viva Saloon. Royal Poinciana trees are a protected tree species and removal or transplanting of the tree requires a permit from the Tree Commission. There is currently no permit or documentation on file regarding the removal of this tree.

A subsequent inspection on February 14, 2020 documented that a young Royal Ponciana tree was missing from the courtyard area. Can you please explain what happened to the tree? Why was the tree removed? Please provide documentation as to when it was removed, who removed it and why. Documentation should include photos of the tree, signed affidavits, and or receipts. This information will be presented to the Tree Commission for their review and discussion at the April 14 Tree Commission meeting. Please submit any additional information including the requested documentation by March 25 otherwise, enforcement proceedings might be initiated.
