On 8/25/2020, at approximately 0920 hours, I (Sgt. M. Siracuse) responded to the Chevron gas station located at 1126 Truman Avenue, reference a naked male subject wondering the area.

Prior to my arrival, I asked KWPD communications to dispatch rescue to that location due to the likelihood that the male subject would be suffering from excited delirium. Upon arrival, I observed a white male, previously identified as Eric Stevenson, walking through the gas station parking lot toward the fuel pump area. I recognized Stevenson from a similar incident that occurred last week. Although last week Stevenson was completing naked, this time he was only wearing a black and red striped tank top. The tank top was waist length, and his buttocks and genitalia were exposed to the public.

As I entered the parking lot, Stevenson tensed his muscles and began pacing toward Ofc. S. Perez, who was standing in from of him, displaying his taser. Ofc. Perez was giving Stevenson clear loud verbal commands to stop, which he ignored. At this point Stevenson went from passively resisting Ofc. Perez to an active level of resistance by charging toward him in an aggressive manner. Bystanders were also yelling to Stevenson to stop and listen to the police. As Stevenson approached Ofc. Perez, I grabbed his right arm and conducted an arm bar takedown, placing him on the pavement as gently as possible.

Stevenson only suffered a minor abrasion to his right hip and right shoulder area as a result of hitting the ground. Once on the ground, Stevenson tensed his muscles and tried to pull away from us to keep us from handcuffing him. Ofc. Perez and I were able to roll Stevenson on his stomach and place him in handcuffs. Once in handcuffs, we turned Stevenson on his side into a recovery position, and then sat him up as rescue approached.

Stevenson was randomly yelling and making odd noises. His eyes were extremely wide open and he had small pupils. Stevenson appeared to be on some kind of hallucinogen.

I followed the ambulance as Stevenson was transported to the LKMC. Once at the hospital, the ER Doctor said he would be Baker Acting Stevenson and Ofc. Perez left him in ER staff custody. Ofc. Perez completed the original incident report.

I took photographs of Stevenson's injuries and met with a witness, Wes Hunter, who provided me his information to complete a RRI report. I completed the RRI, uploaded the photos, and provided the RRI to professional standards. Hunter said he saw the entire thing and the police did a good job, without any excessive force.

My BWC was active for this incident and was uploaded to Evidence. com.
