On January 1, 2021, at approximately 2230 hours, I, Ofc. Waite, was assigned to foot patrol on Duval Street in response to the City of Key West's State of Local Emergency Directive 2020-20.1. My duties were to assist the Key West Police Department, the City of Key West Public Works Department, and the City of Key West Code Compliance Department in clearing Duval Street of pedestrians and enforcing the curfew set in Directive 2020-20.1.

While walking north toward the intersection of Duval Street and Fleming Street, I observed a Key West Police Officer approach a group of subjects on Duval Street. The Officer informed the group of the curfew and asked them to exit Duval Street and return to their residence. The subjects in the group were identified later as Alan Castillo, Ivan Rojas, Daniel Schulmann, Arielle Schulmann, and Danielle Schulmann. The group immediately became confrontational and expressed their disdain of the curfew and the Key West Police Department. The group slowly made their way across Duval Street, often stopping to angrily confront the Officer as he escorted them off the street. The group stopped underneath the La Concha at which point Arielle Schulmann began video recording the Officers on her cell phone. I approached Arielle and advised her that a curfew was in effect and if she failed to return home she would be arrested. Arielle refused to walk away and shouted at me that she was on her way home, despite making no effort to turn around and return to her residence. I informed Arielle that she was under arrest and attempted to place her into handcuffs. Arielle immediately pulled away from me displaying active resistance. While attempting to gain physical control of Arielle, her father, Daniel Schulmann, exclaimed "that's my daughter!" and violently lunged towards me, obstructing my attempts of taking Arielle into custody. My fellow Officers addressed Daniel as I placed Arielle into handcuffs. Once in custody, I walked Arielle to the Key West Police Department Transport van which was parked on Duval Street.

As I stood near the transport van, a male and female, identified later as Ruth and Jordan Ruffman, approached me from behind. Ruth stated she was related to Arielle and demanded that I tell her why Arielle was being arrested. For Officer safety purposes, I commanded Ruth to back away from me. City of Key West Code Compliance Director Jim Young confronted Ruth and instructed her to back away from me and return home. Ruth refused to walk away and continued to shout at me. I handed Arielle over to a fellow Officer and turned around to face Ruth and Jordan. I instructed Ruth and Jordan to return home in accordance with the curfew. Ruth and Jordan refused. I informed Ruth she was under arrest and attempted to place her into handcuffs, quickly realizing I did not have another set of handcuffs on my person. Ruth immediately pulled away from me, displaying active resistance. While attempting to gain physical control of Ruth, Jordan lunged towards me and shouted, "That's my mother!", obstructing my attempts of taking Ruth into custody. Sgt. Kouri addressed Jordan while I regained physical control of Ruth. As I attempted to place Ruth's hands behind her back, she continued to resist arrest by pulling away from me. I informed my fellow Officers that I needed a set of handcuffs to place on Ruth. Due to Ruth's resistance, I took her to the ground in a controlled manner utilizing a modified armbar takedown. Once on the ground, Ofc. Hernandez placed Ruth into handcuffs. Ruth and Arielle were

On October 28, 2020, The City of Key West enacted State of Local Emergency Directive 2020-20.1. The Directive states "Beginning on Thursday, December 31, 2020, at 10:00 p.m. and ending Sunday, January 3, 2021, at 6:00 a.m., a curfew will be in effect city-wide, from 10:00 p.m. each evening through 6:00 a.m. the next morning". The Directive continues, "All non-essential businesses shall close on or before 10:00 p.m. each night.", "Individuals shall be in their residences or lodging establishments no later than 10:30 p.m. each night", and "During the period of such curfew, no person shall make use of any street or sidewalk for any purpose."

A violation of this emergency directive is a violation of Florida State Statute 252.38 and Florida State Statute 252.50. A Law Enforcement Officer may arrest for any knowing and intentional violation of this emergency directive.

On Friday, January 1st 2021, at around 2000 hours, I (Sgt. Kouri) along with several other KWPD Officers, was assigned to the detail to enforce the Mandatory Emergency Directive Curfew. I was wearing my KWPD Department issued Class B uniform and was readily recognizable as a uniformed Police Officer.

At approximately 2230 hours, The Key West Police Department alongside the City of Key West Code Compliance Department and the City of Key West Public Works Department began clearing Duval Street of all pedestrians in response to Directive 2020-20.1. All pedestrians were informed that a curfew was in effect and asked to return to their residence.

During the Key West Police Department's efforts of gaining voluntary compliance in accordance with Directive 2020-20.1, we were met with resistance by a group of 8-12 subjects on the 400 block of Duval Street, near La Concha Hotel.

I observed as this group was refusing to follow verbal commands given by multiple Officers to vacate from the streets, due to the curfew being in effect. The group was verbally abusive towards the Officers, was using vulgar language towards the Officers, and were being extremely confrontational. I saw a white female, one of the main antagonists of the group, get within inches from one of the KWPD Officer's face and began to loudly scream at him. At this time, the Officer placed his right arm up, in an attempt to gain distance between himself and the aggressive and belligerent female. Due to the curfew violation, as well as thier aggressive and disorderly actions, I told the Officer to arrest the female. As the Officer did this, another male subject, identified as Daniel Schulman, charged violently at the Officer and screamed not to touch his daughter. Due to Schulman's violent action and aggressive advance towards the Officer, he was stopped by Ofc. Bozzetti, Ofc. Ham, Ofc. Howell and myself. Schulman began to aggressively fight with all above listed Officers. During the fight, Schulman kicked Ofc. Howell in the chest. Schulman was able to get off the ground several times during his fight with the uniformed Officers. While Schulman was on the ground fighting, he

aggressively grabbed my ankle, in an attempt to get me off balance and take me to the ground. I advised Ofc. Bozzetti that Schulman had my ankle and Ofc. Bozzetti delivered two, controlled, closed fist strikes to Schulman's arm, which was holding my leg and ankle. During this fight, all Officers were giving loud repetitive verbal commands to Schulman to stop resisting. Schulman ignored all of these commands and continued to aggressively fight with all four Officers. After a lengthy struggle, we were able to gain physical control of Schulman and place him into handcuffs, which were double locked.

It should be noted that Schulman is a professional mixed martial arts fighter, who studies in multiple different forms of martial arts. Schulman was the North American MAS Oyama Full-Contact Karate Champion, for six (6) consecutive years. Schulman is also a member of the North American Grappling Association Hall of Fame. Schulman owns over fifty (50) mixed martial arts training gyms.

While this fight was occurring, the remainder of the antagonist group were involved in several struggles and altercations with the other Officers on scene. The actions of these individuals led to a multiple arrest situation. I placed handcuffs on a second white male subject, who Ofc. Agleev was controlling near the rear of the transport van. This subject had previously tried to attack Ofc. Waite, who was also attempting to arrest one of the other multiple antagonists of the group. While this subject was charging towards Ofc. Waite, I grabbed him in a controlled manner and handed him to Ofc. Agleev.

Due to the speed the incident occurred and because of Schulman's actions, I was unable to activate my BWC to record the incident.

All arrests were placed into the KWPD transport van.

On January 1, 2021 at approximately 2230 hours I, Officer Agleev, was walking down Duval Street as a part of the KWPD New Year Curfew enforcement team.

At the intersection of Duval Street and Fleming Street I saw Sergeant P. Rodriguez talking to a group of individuals refusing to walk away. When I got closer to the group, I recognized one of the individuals Daniel Schulmann from my encounter with him on 12/19/2020, when Code Officer L. Skinner issued him a citation for refusing to wear a mask. Daniel and his family/friends were actively refusing to go home, thus violating the curfew. At some point I saw other officers engaging in a physical altercation with the group. I grabbed the arm of one of the resisting females, later identified as Danielle Schulmann, and redirected her to the ground. Ofc. S. Ham and I handcuffed Danielle behind the back. I walked Danielle to KWPD transport van, which was parked in 400 Block of Duval Street in front of La Concha Hotel.

While I was standing behind the van getting ready to place Danielle inside, I saw Sergeant D. Kouri engaged in a physical altercation with a white male later identified as Jordan Ruffman. Jordan got pushed into to me. I grabbed the head of Jordan and redirected him to the ground. Sergeant Kouri and Ofc. S. Ham handcuffed Jordan behind his back. I kept Jordan on the ground until the physical altercation was over. Sergeant B. Vasquez and I placed Jordan inside the van.

Danielle Schulmann was placed into the van as well.

Officer Wynn transported Danielle and Jordan to the Monroe Country Detention Center.

Since the physical altercation started instantly, I did not have a chance to activate my BWC.
