A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE JOINT INTERAGENCY TASK FORCE - SOUTH TO HOLD THE ANNUAL VETERANS DAY PARADE ON DUVAL STREET FROM 4:00 P.M. TO 8:00 P.M. THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 11, 2021; AUTHORIZING THE CLOSURE OF CERTAIN STREETS OR PORTIONS THEREOF FOR SAID PARADE FROM 4:00 P.M. TO 8:00 P.M; WAIVING ALL FEES FOR REQUIRED CITY SERVICES; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Commission of the City of Key West, Florida, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** That in Resolution 19-174, the City Commission directed the City Manager to "develop language that restricts the use of polystyrene by individuals on public property, temporary vendors on public property, or entities engaged in a contractual relationship with the local government for the local government for the provision of good or services, unless such use is otherwise preempted by law"

SECTION 2. "That the vendor/lessee/licensee acknowledges the City's concern about the negative environmental impact of using disposable polystyrene products, which are neither readily recyclable nor biodegradable. Vendor/Lessee/licensee/contractor therefore commits to refrain from the use of polystyrene/plastic straws, bags, plastic utensils and "to go" packages for food or products sold on any property leased from the City"

SECTION 3. That Joint Interagency Task Force - South is hereby granted permission to hold the annual Veterans Day Parade on Duval Street from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Thursday, November 11, 2021, and the City will close portions thereof from 4:00 p.m. to approximately 8:00 p.m. for said parade.

**SECTION 4.** That pursuant to Section 6-26 (c), for cause shown upon the record, a special exception to the requirement of payment for required city services set forth in Section 6-26 (a) is hereby granted, waiving all fees for required city services for the Veterans Day Parade.

**SECTION 5.** That the applicant acknowledges this authorization may be revoked by the Commission or the City Manager, due to exigent circumstances such as the resurgence of COVID-19 in the community.

**SECTION 6..** That this Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the signatures of the presiding officers and Clerk of the Commission.
